#### **School Updates from Principal Sannes:**

- Minnesota Comprehensive Assessments (MCAs) for all Sibley 3rd, 4th and 5th Graders. An email was sent out on April 9th outlining the schedule for each of the three grade levels.
- Northfield ISD #659 K-5 will be implementing Collaborative Literacy lessons in the 2018-19 school year. Collaborative Literacy incorporates science and social studies, "helping students grow as readers, writers, ad thinkers as they develop the social and emotional skills necessary to thrive." #### Walk-a-thon Funds Update from Pasha Quaas:

- The pies in Principal Sannes' face were a big hit with kids at the assembly.
- More then 100 boxes of flexible seating and come to Sibley! All have been unpacked, assembled, labeled, and delivered to teachers.
  - Many teachers are using their grade-level funds from the Walk-a-thon to purchase additional flexible seats.
  - Thank you to Molly Lloyd for helping unpack, pick up, and assemble!
- The coding robots purchased for Celebrate Math Week have been enjoyed.
- BrainPop, funds for Beyond Words, and grade-level funds have also been distributed.

## Changing the Walk-a-thon to a Read-a-thon, Pasha Quaas:

- The Sibley Walk-a-thon is 12-15 years old and it has "walked" it's course.
- ▶ The Read-a-thon will be two weeks long.
  - The first week will focus on the coin drive.
  - The second week will focus on friend and family donations.
- ▶ The Read-a-thon...
  - will have grade level reading goals.
  - will happen the first two weeks of November.
  - will not compete with conferences, homecoming, back to school shopping, or testing, and will wrap up and be put to bed before the holidays.
  - script will be available for students to use/practice with, and for parents to share on social media.
  - will continue to be Sibley's single main fundraiser.
  - will aim to have a large, family friendly event that the entire school will be invited to attend outside of school hours in celebration of the Read-a-thon.

#### PTO Officer Update from Pasha Quaas:

- Molly Lloyd's term as Vice-President is up this year, and she has agreed to stay on for another 2-year term, beginning the 2018-19 school year.
- Jessica Heilman's term as Treasurer is up this year. Brian McGonegal has offered to fill this role.
- Voting will take place at our next meeting, Tuesday, May 8 at 6:30 in the Sibley Media Center.

## Open discussion about Sibley PTO fundraisers, and the budget.

- The Walk-a-thon was originally introduced as a way to procure the funds necessary to purchase larger ticket items, ie. playground equipment, smart boards, flexible seating, etc.
- Community support of schools has changed. Target no longer donates a percentage of Red Card purchases to the school of the card holder's choice. That used to be around \$5,000 annually for Sibley.
- Does Amazon Smile make up for the loss of Target?
  - No, the percentage that goes to Sibley is so small, and the number of people that use a Smile Account in Sibley 's name when shopping Amazon have not been great enough to compensate.
- Funds raised by the Read-a-thon would allow the PTO to continue supporting the Sibley experience, covering the costs that the corporate support from Target was providing.
- Traditionally, Walk-a-thon funds have been reserved for larger ticket items.
- Walk-a-thon funds purchase BrainPop each year. This is something our teachers ask for and use. Learn more at, <a href="https://www.brainpop.com/">https://www.brainpop.com/</a>
- As funding and support from our community have evolved, so too must the formula we use to cover our expenditures.
- Fundraising opportunities to consider:
  - Culver's night with teacher involvement.
  - Just Food Round Up at the Co-op. Only available every other year.
  - Could families and local businesses sponsor specific items that teachers are asking for?
  - Kid drop in during the holiday shopping season.

#### Budget questions to consider for the May 8th Vote:

- ► Is it time to pool PTO funds?
- Is it time to consider a second fundraiser?
- Should PTO continue to offer free childcare for parents attending the meetings?
- Should PTO continue to offer grade level funding?
