Greetings Families!

What a year it has been. It is hard to imagine that the school year has ended. The students will move to summer mode and start participating in a different set of activities. Thank you for joining the staff here at Greenvale Park on this journey in 2017-18!

This year was my first as Greenvale Park principal and I enjoyed being a part of this supportive and welcoming school community. As a new principal in the fall, one of my goals was to get to know the students as soon as possible. Several students confused me with English Language teacher Matt Berg-Wall in those early weeks. After hearing, "Hello, Mr. Berg-Wall" many times in September and October, I am happy to report that the students and I are much more familiar with each other now! I look forward to getting to know the students even better next fall.

A focus on reading led to a Read-a-thon fundraiser in October. Students and families raised over \$20,000 and more importantly practiced reading in many exciting ways. I Love to Read Month featured several fun events for students with the Olympic theme! A new reading curriculum will be implemented next year for all classrooms. This year, teachers received training and did start to introduce some of the components. Next year, this will be emphasized throughout the year.



Math Madness was a success again this year in March. Students participated in a number of math activities including problem solving and games. Students complete math stations in their classroom daily with a variety of hands-on activities, personalized apps and small group instruction with the teacher. This year we also added a Title 1 support with Mrs. Edwards meeting with small groups of students. Math will continue to be a focus in the next year.

This school year the Second Step Social and Emotional Learning curriculum was implemented in all classrooms. This provided common language to use when students were working with friends and teachers at school. Mrs. Larsen helped support staff and students with resources for this new program. With skits, videos and visuals in place, the second year of the program will be an important one for helping students be more successful in these areas.

Students had many opportunities to be innovative and practice engineering skills. In the fall the STEM Night with The Works from Bloomington provided many hands-on learning options. During Community School, STEM Club was a regular offering and the GVP PTO provided funds to launch two STEM carts that can be moved to different classrooms. Students are showing their creativity and problem solving with these materials!



This newsletter has information for families during the summer including how to contact the schools if needed during June and July. We will see you back in August for Ready.Set.Go Day. We look forward to hearing about summer adventures and seeing you back in the fall. It will be another exciting year of learning at Greenvale Park!

¡Qué año ha sido! Es difícil imaginar que el año escolar haya terminado. Los estudiantes empezarán el modo de verano y comenzarán a participar en un conjunto diferente de actividades. ¡Gracias por unirse al personal aquí en Greenvale Park en este viaje en 2017-18!

Este año fue mi primer año como director de Greenvale Park y disfruté siendo parte de esta comunidad escolar con tanto apoyo y bienvenida. Como nuevo director en el otoño, uno de mis objetivos era llegar a conocer a los estudiantes lo antes posible. Varios estudiantes me confundieron con el profesor de Lengua inglesa Matt Berg-Wall en esas primeras semanas. Después de escuchar, "Hola, Sr. Berg-Wall" muchas veces en septiembre y octubre, ¡me complace informar que los estudiantes y yo estamos mucho más familiarizados los unos con otros ahora! Espero conocer a los estudiantes aún mejor el próximo otoño.

Un enfoque en la lectura condujo a una recaudación de fondos Read-a-thon en octubre. Los estudiantes y las familias recaudaron más de \$ 20,000 y más importante, practicaron la lectura de muchas maneras emocionantes. ¡En el Mes de Me Encanta Leer se presentaron varios eventos divertidos para los estudiantes con el tema Olímpico! Un nuevo currículo de lectura se usará el próximo año para todos los salones. Este año, las maestras y maestros recibieron capacitación y comenzaron a presentar algunos de los componentes. El próximo año, esto se enfatizará durante todo el año.

Math Madness fue un éxito nuevamente este año en marzo. Los estudiantes participaron en una serie de actividades de matemáticas que incluyen la resolución de problemas y juegos. Los estudiantes completan las estaciones de matemáticas en su salón de clases a diario con una variedad de actividades prácticas, aplicaciones personalizadas e instrucción en grupos pequeños con la maestra o maestro. Este año también agregamos un apoyo de Título 1 con la Sra. Edwards reuniéndose con grupos pequeños de estudiantes. Las matemáticas continuarán siendo un área a enfatizar en el próximo año.

Este año escolar se implementó el plan de estudios Second Step Social and Emotional Learning en todos los salones de clases. Esto proporcionó un lenguaje común para usar cuando los estudiantes trabajaban con amigos y maestros en la escuela. La Sra. Larsen ayudó a apoyar al personal y a los estudiantes con recursos para este nuevo programa. 

Trash for Cash Guide

There are many ways you can help the PTO earn money for our school! One of the simplest is to save items that you would otherwise throw away! Many companies will give GVP money for proof of purchase of their products, do you have any of these items in your house?

Box Tops for Education (General Mills): For every Box Top turned in, GVP earns money from General Mills, and by participating in annual promotions we can earn even more!



Loaves for Learning (Country Hearth/Village Hearth): Each Loaves for Learning barcode earns GVP 5¢!

Milk Moola and Donuts to Dough (Kwik Trip): GVP can earn money by saving caps from Kwik Trip milk jugs, orange juice and flavored waters top strips from bags of Nature’s Touch milk, ice cream UPCs, and price ovals from Glaziers Donuts. Each cap and UPC you send to school is worth 5¢, while donut price ovals are worth 10¢!

Save Five for Schools (Land O Lakes): By saving caps from Land O Lakes milk jugs, GVP can earn up to \$10,000 per year. Each cap you send to school is worth 5¢!

EconoFoods Receipts (EconoFoods): Bring in your receipts from your shopping at EconoFoods, and for each \$150,000 in receipts, our local EconoFoods will send GVP a check for \$1000!




Our Family Labels for Learning (EconoFoods): Clip UPC barcodes from Our Family products, and watch for Our Family bonus labels at the checkout. GVP earns 5¢ for each barcode/label!

Labels for Learning (Coborn's): Coborn's offers points for purchases and provides a coupon for those points at the register. If you shop at Coborn's or utilize their delivery service you can earn points for GVP. Each point is worth 1¢.
