Also, students may struggle with peer relationships, bullying, and friendship turmoil which may need mediation.

Speech Team

The Northfield Middle School Speech Team will begin its 2017-2018 winter season the week of **November 13-17!** We are looking for 6th, 7th, and 8th graders who would like to improve and practice their speaking and performing abilities. Speech team isn't really about writing speeches, that is just one of the many categories. Students choose to expressively read literature from categories such as humorous and serious prose, poetry and drama; extemporaneous prose, great speeches, and others. Students chose one category and one selection to perform throughout the season. One 20 minute

practice session each week is required. Practice times are flexible, so students in basketball, ski club and other school activities are able to participate in speech. Orchestra News

The first orchestra concert for this year is on **Thursday, October 26 at 7:00 pm**. This performance will feature the orchestras and choirs from Northfield Middle School. Orchestra students need to be at the Middle School by **6:30 pm** to allow enough time to tune and warm-up before this performance. Concert dress is black and white (please refer to the Orchestra Syllabus for more detailed guidelines).

Orchestra lessons began on Tuesday, September 19. Each student received a lesson schedule and calendar with their lesson days. Students receive one lesson every six days of school (students en-

rolled in private lessons need to fill out a Private Lesson Form instead, in addition to having 1 lesson each quarter with Mrs. Olivier). Lessons focus on technique and orchestra music.

Your child should be showing you their practice calendar to sign each week. Any encouragement you can give towards regular practice is greatly appreciated.

Please check that your student's instrument case is labeled, clearly, with their name, address and phone number. When cases look similar, it is very easy for a student to bring home the wrong instru-

ment without realizing it. Thank you for doing this.

Nurse Notes

ATTENTION 6th Grade students:

Minnesota State Immunization Law requires the following immunizations before entering 7th grade in the fall of 2018.

Please provide a copy for the Health office when shots are given so your health records can be updated at school.

- Tdap, a new one needs to be given unless they had one after their 7th birthday.
- 2 Varicella vaccines OR proof of Chickenpox
- Meningitis (meningococcal) MCV
- All childhood vaccines must be on file
- OR, provide a notarized Legal Exemption, or medical exemption signed by your physician

You may schedule your immunization appointment now with your clinic. Get them done early since supplies become limited in August.

Medication

For prescription medication to be given at school a completed School Medication Administration Form must be on file. The name of the medication, dose, time of day, parent & physician signature is required. School staff are not allowed to administer any prescription medication without this on file.

HEARING AND VISION SCREENING FOR 7TH GRADE

Screening will take place on **November 14, 2017 from 7:57 am - 2:51 pm**. A referral will be mailed home for those students in need of a checkup. Encourage your student to wear their prescribed glasses or hearing aids for success in school. Vision exams are recommended every 2 years. For students that have recently been screened by their physician, may opt out if parents provide a note.

Volunteers needed!! Without our volunteers we cannot have this screening. Please contact the school nurse at 507-663-0656. Thank you!

Sport Physicals

Middle school sports do not require a sport physical, however, if your student will be participating in a High School sport, a physical is required and must be on the Minnesota State High School League Sports Physical form. Those are good for 3 years. Those may be turned into the middle school nurse office and kept in your student's health file. It is also sent to the High School activities office.

Attendance

Please call the attendance line each day that your child is absent. You may reach the 24-hour voice mail system by dialing 663-0655.

E-mailing teachers DOES NOT count as official notification for state attendance records. When calling the attendance line, please leave your student's name, grade, reason for absence and your relationship to the child. If calling in an illness, please leave information regarding symptoms. Our health services staff is required to file a report

with the State Health Department if there is an unusual increase in certain illnesses. Students who are not called in will be considered unexcused until a parent/guardian notifies us. If you should forget to call in, your child may turn in a note to the attendance window outside the office when he/she returns to school. Students may not call in their own absences.

If your child is absent for **three consecutive days**, you may leave a request for homework on the attendance

line when you call in your child's absence information on the third day. Requests should be made by 9:00 a.m., so teachers can use their prep time to gather work. Homework will be requested on your behalf and any available homework can be picked up between 3:00-4:00 p.m.

W.E.B. - Where Everybody Belongs



Each year we have many opportunities for students to participate in athletic and academic activities.




Cell Phones and Electronics
