School Board Meeting November 14, 2005 Northfield High School Media Center

I. Call to Order.

Chairperson Kari Nelson called the meeting of the Board of Education of Independent School District 659 to order at 7:00 p.m.

II. Agenda Changes.

The table file was added.

III. Public Comment.

There was no one.

IV. Approval of Minutes.

On a motion by Stratmoen, seconded by Berthelsen, minutes of the Regular School Board meeting held on October 24, 2005, were approved.

V. Announcements.

- The 7th grade ELC trip to Eagle Bluff went very well this year 197 students, 25 parents and 9 staff participated in the trip!
- After winning the Missota Conference and Section Championships, the Raider boys cross country team competed at the State Meet at St. Olaf College on Saturday, Nov. 5. The cross country team is coached by Merilee Sander, Joe Winegardner and Stephen Cade.
- Sell out crowds attended the Fall Musical, "Oliver" Nov. 4,5,11,12. Over 100 cast and crew members were involved in this effort under the direction of Bob Gregory-Bjorklund.
- Senior Christina Keesey signed paperwork to attend Ohio State in a ceremony at the high school on Wed, Nov. 9. Christina has played varsity tennis at NHS for 5 years with 4 appearances at the State Tournament, finishing 3rd this past season.
- The Gator Girls Swimming and Diving Team finished third in the Section 1A Championships last Friday. Maggie Perrott was the section champion in the 50 Freestyle and 100 Freestyle, Tanya Thomforde was the section champion in the 100 breaststroke.
- Board members highlighted the following activities: Prairie Fire Theater and Peter Pan; the all district band concert; and the Middle School orchestra and choir concert.

VI. Items for Discussion and / or Reports.

1. Elementary Site Continuous Improvement Plan Presentations.

Each of the three elementary buildings presented their site continuous improvement plan. The presentations described the site improvement goals, the data or evidence that was used to identify those goals, and the specific performance targets that the building will use to determine their success in reaching the goals. The presentations also highlighted the specific activities and staff development that each building will complete during the next school year and how progress will be monitored. These plans fit directly with new statutory requirements for improvement plans for all districts and buildings and also provide the basis for the student achievement goal requirements of Q-Comp, should we be able to reach an agreement on implementing that program in our district for 2006-07.

2. Fiber Optics for Greenvale Park, Longfellow and Sibley Schools.

Director of Technology Denise Griffith presented a proposal for the completion of the fiber optic network connecting all of the buildings within the district. Her presentation looked at the impact of the current inequity between those buildings with fiber optic connections and the other buildings in the district. It also described how this project can be completed using a lease purchase program and the benefits for students and staff of completing the network at this time.

VII. Superintendent's Report

 - 1. <u>American Education Week and National Community Education Day Proclamations.</u> On a motion by Smith, seconded by Cirksena, the Board approved the American Education Week Proclamation as presented.

WHEREAS, public schools are the backbone of our democracy, providing young people with the tools they need to maintain our nation's precious values of freedom, civility and equality; and

WHEREAS, by equipping young Americans with both practical skills and broader intellectual abilities, schools give them hope for, and access to, a productive future; and

WHEREAS, schools are community linchpins, bringing together adults and children, educators and volunteers, business leaders, and elected officials in a common enterprise;

National Community Education Day - November 15, 2005.

On a motion by Smith, seconded by Hargis, the Board approved the National Community Education Day Proclamation as presented.

WHEREAS the principles of Community Education are Self-Determination, Self-Help, Leadership Development, Localization, Integrated Delivery of Services, Maximum Use of Resources, Inclusiveness, Responsiveness, and Lifelong Learning; and

WHEREAS the citizens of the Northfield Public School District are committed to enhancing the collaboration and involvement of families, community members, organizations, teachers, and students in problem solving and decision making that lead to a more meaningful, innovative, and boundless experience for all, and

WHEREAS the theme of National Community Education Day in 2005 is Every School a Community School;

The Board of Education approved A. J. Spanjers Company, Inc. as the lowest qualified bidder for the exterior façade renovation at Longfellow School. The cost of the project will be \$18,870.

The Board approved paid bills totaling \$1,484,097.64, payroll checks totaling \$1,674,149.98, bond payments totaling \$262.53 and the financial reports for October 2005.
