School Board Meeting October 23, 2006 Northfield High School Media Center

I. Call to Order.

Chairperson Kari Nelson called the meeting of the Board of Education of Independent School District 659 to order at 7:05 p.m. No one was absent.

II. Agenda Changes.

The table file was added. (ARTech's report was pulled due to Tim Goodwin being ill.)

III. Public Comment.

There was no one.

IV. Approval of Minutes.

On a motion by Cirksena, seconded by Berthelsen, the minutes of the Regular School Board meeting held on October 9, 2006, were approved.

V. Announcements.

• Board Chair Kari Nelson referred to the levy guide that households should have received in the mail during the past few weeks. She stressed how critical it is that the voters approve the levy referenda on November 7.

VI. Items for Discussion and / or Reports

1. Prairie Creek Community School: 2005-2006 Overview.

Caroline Jones, Director of Prairie Creek Community School (PCCS), presented an overview of Prairie Creek's fourth year of operation as a charter school under the sponsorship of the Northfield Public Schools. In each of its four years of operation, PCCS enrolled slightly over 100 students in grades K-5 and currently have 50 students on its waiting list. Ms. Jones outlined for the Board Prairie Creek's program successes and challenges this past school year.

2. ARTech: 2005-2006 Overview.

3. Teaching American History Grant.

Sarah Swan McDonald and Paula Seeberg provided the Board with an update on last year's activities as well as what is being planned for the third and last year of the grant. Since this is a grant provided by the federal government, Roger Jenni has been managing its evaluation and gave the Board his findings.

4. Beyond Words: A Celebration of Arts and Literacy.

Art Teacher Angie Vogt and Reading Specialist Becky Gainey showed a DVD they created illustrating their collaboration at Sibley Elementary School integrating art, reading and writing. Angie and Becky created lessons for each grade level that integrated reading, poetry and an art piece that creatively connected each discipline. The culmination of this collaboration was a family evening event.

5. Reception for National Merit Scholars.

The date for the reception for the National Merit Scholars has been set for Monday, December 11. Since the reception will begin at 6:30 PM, the Board will need to move the starting time of the Board meeting to 7:30 PM, which does require Board action. We will be recognizing five National Merit semi-finalists and three commended students at this year's reception.
