School Board Meeting October 8, 2007 Northfield High School Media Center

I. Call to Order.

Chairperson Kari Nelson called the meeting of the Board of Education of Independent School District 659 to order at 7:00 p.m. No one was absent.

II. Agenda Changes.

The table file was added.

III. Public Comment.

There was none.

IV. Approval of Minutes.

On a motion by Smith, seconded by Stratmoen, the minutes of the Regular School Board meeting held on September 24, 2007, were approved.

V. Announcements and Recognitions.

- The "Walk to School" event on October 3 went off without a hitch. There were plenty of adult volunteers and teachers helping out with this event. Dan Kust reported that they counted 133 students participating in the morning.
- Four Northfield High School seniors have been named National Merit semi-finalists. They are Charles Behr, David Block, Joseph Cherney and Samuel Dunnewold. In addition, Northfield High School seniors Eric Emmons, Magdalene Kruse, Tom Pokorney and Ashley Tollefson have been named Commended Students. The success of all these talented seniors is a testimony to the great teachers and staff who work in this district and the solid support from our parents and community. As we did last year, we will be holding a reception for the National Merit Scholars and their families on Monday, December 10 right before the School Board meeting. The reception will start at 6:30 PM, which will then move the start of the Board meeting to 7:30 PM.

VI. Items for Discussion and / or Reports

1. Contingency Fund Update.

Superintendent Richardson updated the Board on additional staffing provided to several buildings based on the October 3rd review of classrooms where student numbers or needs potentially required additional teacher or educational assistant support. This update was a follow up to an earlier presentation to the Board describing how the first 2.0 FTE were distributed to Greenvale Park, Bridgewater and the High School.

2. Prairie Creek Community School Annual Report.

Caroline Jones, Director of Prairie Creek Community School, presented a review of Prairie Creek's fifth year of operation as a charter school under the sponsorship of the Northfield Public Schools and an overview of this current school year. Currently, Prairie Creek has 120 students enrolled in grades K through 5. However, due to an expansion program that is scheduled to be completed by the fall of 2009, they hope to enroll 180 students by adding three classrooms, and a gymnasium and performing arts center.

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VII. Superintendent's Report

1. School Board Policies.

On a motion by Cirksena, seconded by Smith, the Board approved Policy 512 - School Sponsored Student Publications and Activities and Policy 518 - Do Not Resuscitate/Do Not Intubate Orders, as presented.

2. December 10, 2007, Regular School Board Meeting.

On a motion by Cirksena, seconded by Smith, the Board approved a 7:30 PM start time for only the December 10, 2007, Regular School Board meeting to accommodate the reception for the District's National Merit Scholars.

B. Items for Consent Grouping.

On a motion by Stratmoen, seconded by Hargis, the Board approved the following items listed under the Consent Grouping.

1. Gift Agreement.

The Sibley Elementary School PTO has donated \$4600. \$4400 is to be used for classroom supplies by the teachers and \$200 is to help fund the kindness retreat.

2. Grant Requests.

- The Board approved a \$131,754 grant proposal to the MN Department of Human Services. Titled "Family, Friend and Neighbor Grant" this project will provide outreach and services to childcare providers and their families in four neighborhoods in Northfield and Faribault. These neighborhoods have a high population of low income, immigrant and refugee families.
- The \$60,000 grant request to the Office of Juvenile Justice/Department of Public Safety by the Tackling Obstacles and Raising College Hopes (TORCH) collaborative was approved. This grant request is in addition to a \$42,000 grant received by TORCH from the Department of Higher Education to support the goal of increasing the graduation rate and attendance at post-secondary institutions of Latino and first generation college students.
- The Board approved two grant requests to the Minnesota State High School League Foundation. One is for \$14,750 and would be used to subsidize fee waivers for student participation in athletic and art programs. The other request is for \$5,000 and would be used to support the activities of the RALIE program (Raider Activity Leaders Improving Enthusiasm).

3. Financial Reports.
