School Board Minutes April 9, 2012 Northfield High School Media Center

I. Call to Order.

Board Chair Ellen Iverson called the Regular meeting of the Northfield Board of Education to order at 7:00 PM. No one was absent.

II. Agenda Changes / Table File The table file was added.

III. Public Comment

There was no one.

IV. Approval of Minutes

On a motion by Nelson, seconded by Quinnell, minutes of the Regular School Board meeting held on March 26, 2012, were unanimously approved.

- V. Announcements and Recognitions
  - Congratulations to 8th grader Jack Morrison who won this year's Middle School Geography Bee in December. He qualified for the State Geography Bee by scoring as one of the top 100 participants on the National Geographic Society's written exam. On March 30th, Jack participated in the State Geography Bee, which was held on the campus of St. Cloud State University.
  - The Southeastern Minnesota Arts Council (SEMAC) has approved Northfield Public Schools Community Services Division's grant request of \$6,500 for expenses related to Books and Stars 2012. Books and Stars is a partnership between Northfield Public Schools Community Services Division and the Northfield Public Library to bring an art or cultural experience into the community while promoting literacy and having library resources available. Books and Stars will be held on Wednesday evenings, beginning in June 6.
  - Greenvale Park held its fourth annual Evening of the Arts on April 3. The event was meant to not only highlight student projects, but also to provide an opportunity for students and parents to stop at stations throughout the school and make watercolor butterflies, origami, pen wraps and get a balloon animal. The evening also included performances by students in the fifth grade orchestra, fifth grade choir and the readers' theater performed during the evening. The evening was collaboration between fine arts and classroom teachers.
  - Bridgewater students participated in an annual Spring Break Read-a-Thon with prizes for all students who participated. Students who met their grade level goal received a Mini Murphy from Papa Murphy's Pizza. One student per grade level was selected to dine with the principal for lunch. The grade level class that read the most minutes earned a pizza party compliments of Papa Murphy's Pizza. Those classes were: Ms. Wisdorf's morning class, Sra. Siefert's first grade class, Sra. Born's second grade class, Sra. Larson's third grade class, Mrs. Schuster's fourth grade class, and Mrs. Kohl and Mr. Rauk's fifth grade classes (their classes were only 10 minutes apart, so they were both recognized). Thank you to the Parrish family at Papa Murphy's and their support of reading!
  - Bridgewater will be celebrating Earth Day on April 20th. This is a great opportunity for the students to learn different ways to care for our earth.
  - April 16-20 is Severe Weather Awareness Week. There will be a tornado drill in each building on Thursday, April 19th to practice where students and staff would go in case of an actual tornado.
  - Volunteer Appreciation Week is April 15-21. We are fortunate to have many great volunteers that help in many ways every day. Thank you volunteers!
  - Administrative Professional Appreciation Week is April 22-28. Thank you to all of our District administrative professionals for all they do.
  - Northfield Patch is partnering with Greenvale Park, one of the schools working with HCI, to highlight students and their "sparks." Patch's first video highlighted GVP fifth grade student Ariana Beeby, which was posted on March 20, 2012.
  - U.S. Figure Skating Online featured the collaboration between the Northfield Skating School and Community Services in its "Club Spotlight."

## VI. Item for Discussion and / or Reports

Professional Learning Communities Presentation – Sibley Elementary School.
 Sibley Elementary School Principal Scott Sannes introduced Sibley's First Grade teachers Amanda Sieger, Gretchen Heil, Judi Vitito, and Katie Shorma and then showed a DVD produced by Middle School Media Specialist Amy Sieve. The presentation spotlighted the First Grade PLC by showing how differentiating instruction is tied to flexible grouping using enrichment or remediation activities.

#### 2. Fees for Student Activities for 2012-2013.

During this school year the Activities Advisory Committee (AAC) has been discussing and researching how Waiver Fees are administered. Currently, students who qualify for Free and/or Reduced Lunch, or those having other financial hardships, are able to have 100% of their Activity Fee waived. The AAC is recommending the following change to this policy and for it to go into effect in the fall 2012.

All students in item numbers 1 and 2 below must qualify under the current school year's Free or Reduced Meal Program guidelines administered by the School District's Child Nutrition Department.

- 1. Students who qualify for the <u>Free Meal Program would be required to pay 20%</u> of the total cost of the activity for which they are enrolling.
- 2. Students who qualify for the <u>Reduced Meal Program</u> would be required to <u>pay 40%</u> of the total cost of the activity.
- 3. Students who do <u>not</u> qualify for a Free or Reduced Meal Program, but who have a financial hardship, would submit an application for a scholarship, and if granted, would be required to <u>pay at least 20%</u> toward the activity fee.

The AAC is <u>not</u> proposing an increase in the actual Activity Fee.

This format aligns very closely with what Community Services utilizes as well as what Northfield High School and Northfield Middle School currently implement in their curricular programs. It is anticipated that the Board will take action on this AAC recommendation at its April 23, 2012 meeting.
