
# Northfield and Randolph Relationship

- Started in 1994 with one student attending morning Ag class in Randolph.
- Average 12-15 students per year
- This year there are 19 students from Northfield that make up 25% of the students Ed see's on a daily basis.
- Ed rotates curriculum every other year which includes welding one year and Ag mechanics the following year.

# Outreach Program

- Once a month Ed host's his Ag outreach class that is for freshman and sophomore's from Northfield who aren't eligible for day class as well as Junior's and Senior's that can't fit day class into there class load.
- The program has students from 6 different school districts.
- New Prague, Northfield, Rosemount, Hastings, Lakeville, and Randolph. Formerly included Jordan, Faribault, Cottage Grove, and Home Schooled Students.
- This program allows students to stay involved in the chapter and learn about agriculture as well as meet and interact with other students.




### Alumni's Role








### National Convention
