BUS ARRIVES AT APPROXIMATELY 7:15 A.M.

LEAVE NORTHFIELD APPROXIMATELY - 7:30 A.M.

1ST STOP - 8:50 Snack/Bathroom Break. 10 minutes.

Clear Lake: Exit 194

Park at "Kum & Go"

2ND STOP - 10:55 - 11:35 Gas and Lunch

Exit 92, Ankeny, IA

Drop kids off at Arby's. Many places to go. Gas up at Amoco and you won't need to gas up again until St. Joseph. NOTE: to get diesel gas, go West for 4 stop lights to the Hy Vee Gas Station.

3RD STOP - 1:20 - 1:45 Dairy Queen Exit 92, Bethany, Missouri

Ice Cream / Bathroom Break.

4TH STOP - 2:45 - 4:45

Kearney Family Farm. Exit 26 (Hwy 92)

5TH STOP - St. Joseph approximately 5:45 Check in hotel.

St. Joseph Holiday Inn 102 South 3rd Street Downtown Hwy 295 to 229
(exit 43) to 3rd Street (exit 6A)

6TH STOP - 6:00 - 7:30 Supper. Park at *Village Steak House*. Kids can eat where they want

Back to Hotel and Gas up for tomorrow

* On the way back to hotel...drive by antebellum houses on Hall Street. You must take 6th street to get there. 9th St. doesn't run into Hall.

Sunday, June 9

Students will eat breakfast at the Holiday Inn Buffet from 6:00 a.m. - 10:00 a.m

1ST STOP: 9:00 a.m. Patee House Museum / Jesse James House
(right next to Patee House). Kids, if interested, may also go to the
Penn Street Square Antiques after Patee House or students can stay in
Patee House (Penn Street Square is across the street from Patee House)

Meet back on bus at 11:30. On the way out of town...drive by hill which once held Jesse's
house: Go to 13th Street (left from Japanese Tea Garden near Patee House) and take a right on
Lafayette. It is on the right side with a marker.

Take Interstate 36 East to 35 North
Take Highway 35 North into Iowa to highway 2 (exit 12) to Corydon.
Distance from St. Joe to Corydon approximately 134 miles.

TENTATIVE PLAN - DISCUSS WITH DRIVER WHEN LEAVING ST. JOSEPH

Go north on #35 to Winston, Missouri (exit 61) Hwy 69

Go east 3 miles (from I-35 exit) past to just outside Winston and down the hill to the
stone bridge on north side of the highway. Go past the bridge about 1/2 mile to cross road. Turn
around and go back to bridge. Pull off to side (bus is visible enough for traffic to see it from
either direction) Explore under railroad trestle for about 15 - 20 minutes.

2ND STOP: If the students didn't eat breakfast - eat in Corydon at 2:00 at either C.J.'s
Cafe or the Pizzeria both of which are next to each other downtown. If
the students did eat breakfast go to Corydon Museum first and eat afterwards

3RD STOP: Either 2:00 or 3:00 p.m. Prairie Trails Museum of Wayne County (Corydon
Iowa) Highway 2 East (Exit 12 Highway 2)

Leave Corydon by 4:00

4TH STOP: 7:00 - 7:15 Bathroom break Rest area Exit 121

5TH STOP 7:40 - 8:10 Exit 194 near Clear Lake for a late supper.

6TH STOP: Exit 214 (Lake Mills / Northwood exit) Last stop for bathroom at wayside rest in
Northern Iowa.

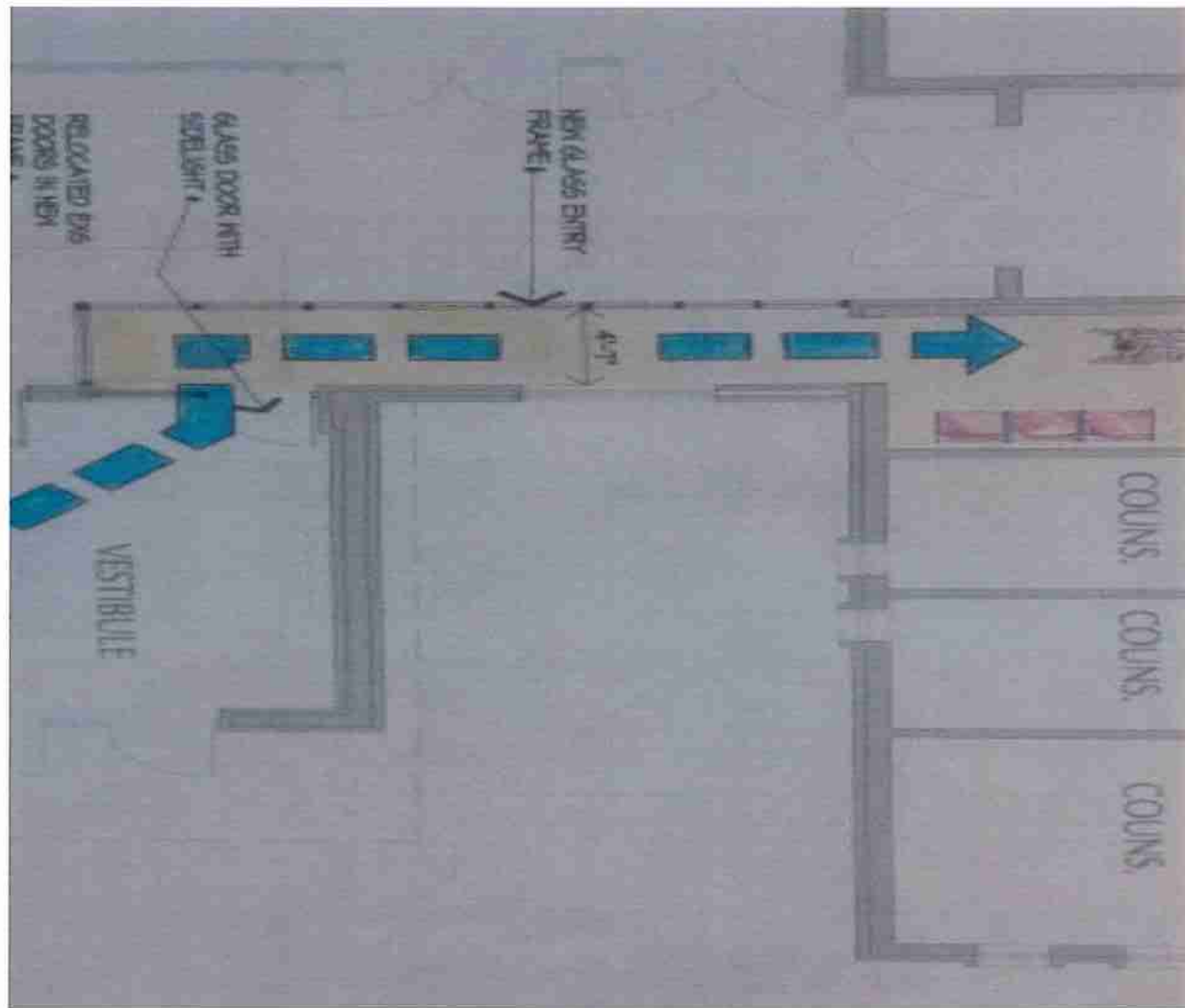

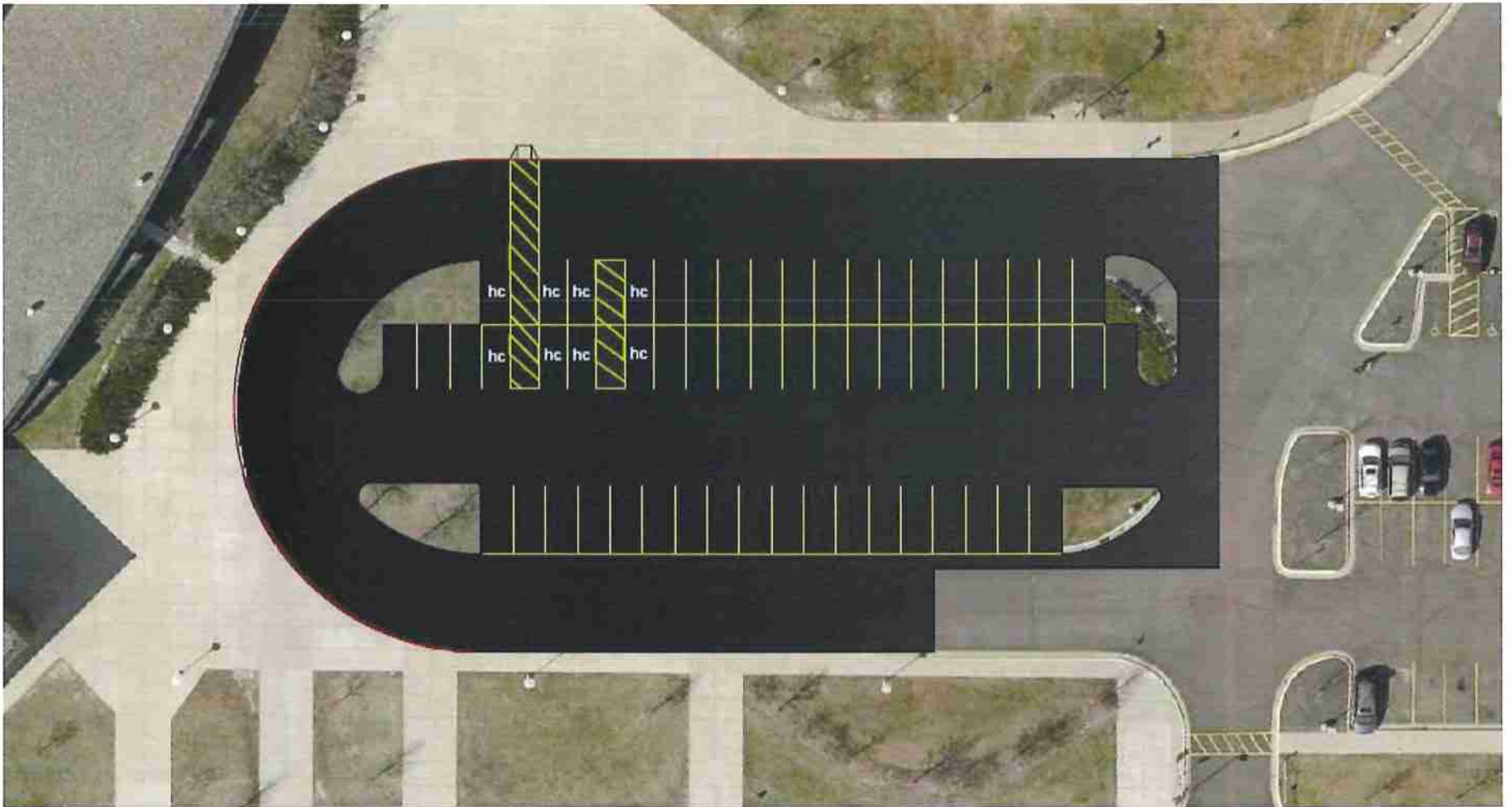
