A. Items for Individual Action

1. Resolution Establishing Combined Polling Places for Multiple Precincts and Designating Hours during which the Polling Places will Remain Open for Voting for School District Elections Not Held on the Day of a Statewide Election.

A new election law from the 2017 Legislative Session requires school districts to approve a resolution to combine polling places in the event the school district were to hold a special election. This resolution must be approved by December 31 of each year, whether the school district intends to hold a special election or not. The Board must designate the combined polling places they would use in the future calendar year and notify county auditors by sending them a copy of the resolution. Combined polling places must be a location currently designated for use by a county or municipality.

At the November 26, 2018, School Board meeting options for potential combined polling places were discussed. Administration is recommending Board approval of the combined polling places presented as listed in the Resolution.

Superintendent's Recommendation: Motion to approve the Resolution Establishing Combined Polling Places for Multiple Precincts and Designating Hours during which the Polling Places will Remain Open for Voting for School District Elections Not Held on the Day of a Statewide Election.

2. World's Best Workforce 2018-2019 Annual Report.

Superintendent's Recommendation: Motion to approve the 2018-2019 World's Best Workforce Annual Report as presented.

3. Certify Final 2018 Payable 2019 Tax Levy.

This action completes the School District's process that began in August with the initial submission of data to the Department of Education, our subsequent review and analysis of the Department's calculation, and the estimate of the School District's property tax base by Rice, Goodhue and Dakota counties. A Truth in Taxation presentation followed by public comment was held as part of the Regular Board meeting on December 10th to provide a final opportunity for community feedback to the proposed levy. This levy, payable in 2019, will be a component of the 2019-20 fiscal budget.

Superintendent's Recommendation: Motion to certify to County Auditors the 2018 Payable 2019 Final Certified Levy Limitation and Certification Report in the amount of \$20,025,845.72.

4. Fiscal Year 2018-2019 General Fund Budget Revision.

The Director of Finance Val Mertesdorf is recommending the following revisions to the School Board for the FY19 general fund budget. The adopted general fund revenue and expenditure budget for FY19 was \$54,008,294 and \$53,168,513 respectively. The recommended revised budget for FY19 is revenues of \$53,928,294 and expenditures of \$53,493,724. The major factors contributing to these changes include a slight decrease in the enrollment projection, Board approved staffing additions since June 30th, gymnastics equipment purchase, and a detailed analysis of the final audited data from FY18.

Superintendent's Recommendation: Motion to approve the revised 2018-19 general fund budget of revenues of \$53,928,294 and expenditures of \$53,493,724.

Truth in Taxation | 2018 Pay 2019 Levy Certification | December 10, 2018

Val Mertesdorf, Director of Finance

The Truth in Taxation presentation is designed to provide an opportunity for the District to share information with the public regarding our levy and budget. The law also allows the public an opportunity to speak.

Levy Cycle

Each year the county assessors determine each property's estimated market value and assign a class. There are 40 different property classes set by statute in the state of Minnesota. The county auditor calculates the net tax capacity for each taxing jurisdiction. The local tax rate of a jurisdiction is determined by dividing the total certified levy by the net tax capacity to establish rates and then applies those to each property.

The tax capacity for Northfield Public Schools had increased each year. The increase in tax capacity includes increased property values as well as additional taxable parcels.

The levy we set as required by law is a fixed dollar amount. Regardless of whether or tax capacity is growing, we are still collecting that dollar amount. A decrease in our tax capacity does not indicate a decrease in the amount of taxes collected.

There are several factors that affect your property tax amount. The most significant being our voter approved referendum as well as our increased enrollment. More than 60% of our levy is enrollment based formulas. Other factors include legislative changes, levy adjustments from prior years, changes in market values, class rates and levies by other taxing jurisdictions.

2018 Pay 2019 Property Tax Levy Summary

Our certified levy authority is up \$769,716.83 or 4.0% compared to one year ago. Our proposed Pay 2019 levy is a total of \$20,025,845.72.

This is due to a few factors, including:

- 1. Increase in enrollment
- 2. Voter approved increase to debt service levy (\$245,551.40)

Levy Authority vs. Certification

Our Pay 2019 property tax levy seeks to use the maximum authority provided by the Minnesota Department of Education. By seeking maximum authority, the District will levy \$769,716.83 more than it did last year. These funds will be used judiciously to maintain our programming for as long as possible.

2019 Property Tax Levy Breakdown

The District's property tax levy of \$20,025,845.72 supports the following:

- Debt Service 28%
- General Fund: Referendum 43%

- General Fund: Other 23%
 - o Includes Location Equity Revenue, Operating Capital, LTFM, Building Lease, and OPEB
- Capital Levy: 4%
- Community Services: 2%

Subtotal Comparisons

The District's Pay 2019 levy includes a 5.0 % increase in debt service, a 3.7% increase in general fund dollars and a 0.3% decrease in community services. The District's Pay 2019 levy includes a 5.9% increase in the amount authorized by the voters and a 0.4 % increase in the 'other' portion of the levy.

The general fund increase is a direct result of increased enrollment as well as the inflationary factor included on our operating referendum. Our debt service increased based on the bond referendum question that was successful on November 6th.

As a testament to this community's generous support of education you can see that 69.8% of our total levy is voter approved.

Levy History

I think it is important to note that over the last six years our average increase has been 4.85%. Two out of six years we decreased our levy. We are incredibly fortunate to live in a community that supports education whole heartedly. The burden on tax payers is significant and unfortunately is not equitable across the state due to many legislative rules. We will continue to be responsible stewards and advocate for our community at the legislature.

2018-19 General Fund Budget Amendment | December 10, 2018

Val Mertesdorf, Director of Finance

Each year the District revises the General Fund Budget after the year has started and we have more accurate information. As a requirement of the Truth in Taxation process we must discuss the budget and we take the opportunity to revise it at this time.

We now have our audited financials from the prior fiscal year, our October 1 enrollment is no longer a projection, we have settled our employment agreements, hired staff and we have our allocations for federal funding from MDE. We take all this information and compare to the adopted budget presented in June and see which areas of the budget need to be adjusted. We input the October 1st enrollment and the final 17-18 enrollment into our projection model and use historical averages and the cohort survival method to predict future enrollment. In June we projected that we would have roughly 4,500.2 weighted pupil units which is typically a conservative estimate. With our updated Oct 1st enrollment we are now showing 4,487.4 weighted pupil units, a slight decrease. The enrollment model we use while conservative, does weight more heavily on recent years. We had two years with fairly significant growth and that is now leveling out. This is one of the reasons we monitor enrollment closely.

The General Fund Budget Amendment will include increasing revenues by \$80,000 which is due to the decreased enrollment projection. The other revenue categories are appropriately aligned.

The General Fund Budget Amendment will include increasing expenditures by \$325,211. There are a few factors creating this increase. The adopted budget is typically forecasted from the current fiscal year budget. Once the audit is complete we do a budget to actual analysis to make sure we are on track or make corrections if needed.

- Salaries& Benefits Increase approximately \$104,783
 - Staffing increases approved by the board since July
 - O Increase in life insurance premium, three year renewal
- Purchased Services Increase approximately \$10,946
- Supplies/Other Increase \$139,482
 - O High School and Middle School flexible furniture (\$60,000) each school had contracted with a supplier who was unable to produce the furniture before June 30th. They had saved a significant portion of their discretionary budget to make these purchases. We allowed a one-time carry-over of the funds due to the supplier issue.
 - O Discretionary budget allocations are increased based on enrollment counts.
 - O Custodial Supplies Director of Buildings & Grounds, Jim Kulseth and I reviewed the custodial supply budgets and noted they had not kept pace with inflation or the amount of in house work our talented staff complete. We analyzed spending patterns and initiated a process for tracking consumable supplies on a per square foot basis to ensure consistent spending as well as separately tracking "repair" supplies. (\$100,000)
- Capital/Equipment Increase \$71,000
 - Gymnastics Equipment

The 2018-19 adopted budget is based on several estimates and the unassigned fund balance is one of them. We spent down our unassigned fund balance more than originally projected. We are expecting a budget surplus for 2018-19 after the generous increase to the operating referendum. However, we are expecting to maintain our unassigned fund balance as a percentage of our total expenditures. We are currently projected to end 2018-19 with 21.1% unassigned fund balance as a percentage of our total general fund expenditures. It will be critical for the District to manage our expenditure growth over the next several years to ensure we are able to maintain our programming for as long as possible.

The District continues to strive to be good stewards of the dollars entrusted to us by the taxpayers. The District has demonstrated this by using fund balance to pay for the security upgrades instead of borrowing funds, using operating capital fund balance to respond quickly to help our Raiders Gymnastics team and refunding debt so the

TRUTH IN TAXATION 2018 Pay 2019 Levy Certification

Levy Cycle

- 1. Assessors determine a property's estimated market value and assign a property class to each parcel.
- 2. The County Auditor calculates the net tax capacity for each parcel in the county, as well as the total net tax capacity for each taxing jurisdiction.
 - a) A property's net tax capacity is determined by multiplying the property's market value by the relevant class rate.
 - i. Class rates are set by statue, vary by property type, and are uniform statewide.
- 3. The local tax rate of a taxing jurisdiction is determined by dividing the jurisdiction's total levy by the jurisdiction's taxable net tax capacity.
 - a) Each jurisdiction sets its own levy and follows specific limits set by state law.

Levy Cycle

- 4. The County Auditor divides the final levy by the District's net tax capacity (or referendum market value) to establish rates.
- 5. The County Auditor applies those rates to each parcel and prepares the final statements for mailing.
- 6. Minnesota Department of Education (MDE) sets the maximum levy limit for each school district, based on current legislation and formulas.
- 7. The School Board adopts a proposed levy in September, holds a public meeting, then finalizes the levy amount in December.

Property Tax Changes

Many factors may cause the individual property tax statement to increase or decrease from year to year:

- Voter approved referendums
- Changes in enrollment
- Levy adjustments to prior years
- Legislative changes
- Changes in market values
- Changes in class rates/history
- Levies by other taxing jurisdictions



 Resolution Authorizing The Approval Of The Sale Of General Obligation School Building Bonds, Series 2019A; Covenanting And Obligating The District To Be Bound By And To Use The Provisions Of Minnesota Statutes, Section 126C.55 To Guarantee The Payment Of The Principal And Interest On The Bonds.

On a motion by Stratmoen, seconded by Iverson, the Board unanimously authorized the Resolution Authorizing The Approval Of The Sale Of General Obligation School Building Bonds, Series 2019A; Covenanting And Obligating The District To Be Bound By And To Use The Provisions Of Minnesota Statutes, Section 126C.55 To Guarantee The Payment Of The Principal And Interest On The Bonds.

BE IT RESOLVED by the School Board of Independent School District No. 659, State of Minnesota, as follows:

1. The Board hereby finds that it is necessary and expedient to sell and issue not to exceed \$40,975,000 principal amount of general obligation school building bonds of Independent School District No. 659 (Northfield Public Schools) (the "District") approved by the voters of the District at a special election held on November 6, 2018. Said bonds (the "Bonds") shall provide funds for the acquisition and betterment of school sites and facilities, including the construction and equipping of a new elementary

school facility; the construction of additions to and renovations of the Bridgewater and Sibley Elementary School sites and facilities; the construction of renovations and improvements to the Longfellow School; and the construction of renovations and improvements to the Greenvale Park Elementary School to convert that facility for use as an early childhood center.

- 2. The Board, having been advised by Ehlers & Associates, Inc., the District's municipal advisor, hereby determines that this issue shall be privately sold after receipt of written proposals, as authorized pursuant to Minnesota Statutes, Section 475.60, Subdivision 2.
- 3. On approximately January 10, 2019, the Superintendent or Director of Finance and a Board Officer are authorized and directed to receive all proposals presented in conformity with the Terms of Proposal contained in the Official Statement, the terms of which are ratified and confirmed in all respects, and to approve on behalf of the District the sale of the Bonds to the party submitting the most favorable proposal (the "Purchaser"). If the true interest rate of the most favorable of said proposals does not exceed 4.00% and a favorable recommendation to accept the proposal is received from Ehlers & Associates, Inc., the Superintendent or Director of Finance and a Board Officer are authorized and directed to accept the same as though the price and interest rate had been included herein. In the Terms of Proposal, the District will reserve the right, after proposals are opened and prior to award, to increase or decrease the principal amount of the Bonds offered for sale or the amount of any individual maturity, with the increase or decrease to occur in multiples of \$5,000 in any of the maturities. The Superintendent or Director of Finance and a Board Officer are authorized and directed to endorse an acceptance on both copies of the most favorable proposal and to send one copy to the Purchaser.
- 4. Upon approval of the sale of the Bonds by the Superintendent or Director of Finance and a Board Officer, the Board will meet at a subsequent meeting to adopt the necessary approving resolution as drafted by the District's Bond Counsel.
- 5. (a) The District hereby covenants and obligates itself to notify the Commissioner of Education of a potential default in the payment of principal and interest on the Bonds and to use the provisions of Minnesota Statutes, Section 126C.55 to guarantee payment of the principal and interest on the Bonds when due. The District further covenants to deposit with the Bond Registrar or any successor paying agent three (3) days prior to the date on which a payment is due an amount sufficient to make that payment or to notify the Commissioner of Education that it will be unable to make all or a portion of that payment. The Bond Registrar for the Bonds is authorized and directed to notify the Commissioner of Education if it becomes aware of a potential default in the payment of principal or interest on the Bonds or if, on the day two (2) business days prior to the date a payment is due on the Bonds, there are insufficient funds to make that payment on deposit with the Bond Registrar. The District understands that as a result of its covenant to be bound by the provisions of Minnesota Statutes, Section 126C.55, the provisions of that section shall be binding as long as any Bonds of this issue remain outstanding.
- (b) The District further covenants to comply with all procedures now or hereafter established by the Departments of Management and Budget and Education of the State of Minnesota pursuant to Minnesota Statutes, Section 126C.55, subdivision 2(c) and otherwise to take such actions as necessary to comply with that section. The chair, clerk, superintendent or business manager is authorized to execute any applicable Minnesota Department of Education forms.

The motion for the adoption of the foregoing resolution was duly seconded by Member Iverson and, upon vote being taken thereon, the following voted in favor thereof: Goerwitz, Stratmoen, Quinnell, Colangelo, Iverson, Pritchard

and the following voted against the same: None

whereupon said resolution was declared duly passed and adopted.

3. Management Plan for Lead-in-Water.

On a motion by Iverson, seconded by Goerwitz, the Board unanimously approved the District Management Plan for Lead-in-Water as presented. The State of Minnesota required the formal adoption of our internal plan. Motion carried.

4. <u>Dundas Dome Lease Agreement for 2019</u>.

On a motion by Colangelo, seconded by Quinnell, the Board unanimously approved the lease agreement between Northfield Public Schools and Dundas Dome for the time period January 1, 2019 through December 31, 2019 as presented. Motion carried.

- B. Police-School Liaison Officer Contract. Superintendent Hillmann recommended the approval of a contract renewal with the City of Northfield for the 2019-2021 calendar years, and that the name be changed from Police-School Liaison Officer to School Resource Officer. He explained the City of Northfield recently completed a compensation study and has increased salaries for employees, including police officers. The District is scheduled to pay the same rate as the previous contract (\$49,852 annually) prorated for the period of January 1, 2019 through June 30, 2019. Beginning July 1, 2019 the District's annual payment will increase to \$58,722, prorated for the second half of 2019. The District covers roughly half of the officer's salary/benefits and is guaranteed at least half of the officer's time. He explained the contract will be an item for action at the December 10th school board meeting.
- C. Combined Polling Places for Future Elections. A new election law from the 2017 Legislative Session requires school districts to approve a resolution to combine polling places in the event the school district were to hold a special election. The Board reviewed the recommended combined polling places and Superintendent Hillmann explained the Board will be asked to approve this resolution at the December 10th meeting.
- D. NHS Student Activities Fall 2018 Report. Director of Student Activities Joel Olson presented a recap of NHS Fall 2018 athletics and activities, as well as academic achievements.
- E. <u>Gymnastics Lease Agreement</u>. The Board received a copy of the signed and executed gymnastics lease agreement for the time period November 26, 2018 through March 31, 2019.

SCHOOL RESOURCE OFFICER AGREEMENT

This AGREEMENT, made this 10th day of December, 2018, by and between Independent School District No. 659 ("SCHOOL DISTRICT") and the City of Northfield, a Minnesota municipal corporation ("CITY"), (collectively, the "PARTIES").

WHEREAS, SCHOOL DISTRICT is in need of and desires to receive certain law enforcement services from CITY; and

WHEREAS, CITY, through its police department, is willing and able to provide certain law enforcement services to SCHOOL DISTRICT; and

WHEREAS, SCHOOL DISTRICT and CITY desire to join in a mutual effort to curb delinquency and crime in the community and to develop better community understanding of law and law enforcement.

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the mutual agreements and provisions herein set forth, SCHOOL DISTRICT and CITY agree as follows:

- 1. SCHOOL RESOURCE OFFICER. For the purpose of this AGREEMENT, the term School Resource Officer shall have the meaning and duties described in this Section.
 - 1.1. School Resource Officer. The School Resource Officer will be an Officer of the Northfield Police Department ("NPD") who shall be responsible for performing the duties set forth in Paragraph 1.4 of this Section;
 - 1.2. The School Resource Officer will be for the purposes of this AGREEMENT a Contracted Agent of the SCHOOL DISTRICT and have access to all such information deemed necessary for the completion of the School Resource Officer duties as approved by the SCHOOL DISTRICT.
 - 1.3. School Resource Officer Employed by CITY. The Northfield Police Chief shall assign a law enforcement officer to serve as the School Resource Officer in SCHOOL DISTRICT. The Chief of Police in conference with SCHOOL DISTRICT officials shall select the officer. The School Resource Officer shall be a licensed peace officer in the NPD and an employee of CITY, and will operate under the direct administration and supervision of the Chief of Police or his/her designee. Law enforcement services rendered to SCHOOL DISTRICT under this AGREEMENT shall be at the sole discretion of the Chief of Police. CITY shall assume all obligations and payments with regard to School Resource Officer salaries and benefits including workers compensation, PERA, withholding taxes, etc. SCHOOL DISTRICT will reimburse CITY for such expenses pursuant to Section 4 of this AGREEMENT. Consistent with the relationship between the PARTIES, the School Resource Officer shall not be represented to the public as an employee of SCHOOL DISTRICT by either CITY or SCHOOL DISTRICT.

- 1.4. Duties of the School Resource Officer. The School Resource Officer will:
 - 1.4.1. Strive to develop a better understanding within SCHOOL DISTRICT's schools of the law enforcement process.
 - 1.4.2. Meet regularly with SCHOOL DISTRICT's administrators and special education personnel regarding law enforcement procedures and juvenile court procedures, and impart knowledge of families, neighborhoods, individuals, statistics, and trends when requested and in accordance with applicable law. The Police Chief shall meet with SCHOOL DISTRICT'S administrative team at least twice during the school year, preferably once at the start and once at the end of each school year in order to assess current police involvement in the schools.
 - 1.4.3. Confer with SCHOOL DISTRICT parents, students, neighbors, school personnel and other members of the community regarding pre-delinquent behavior.
 - 1.4.4. Conduct investigations within SCHOOL DISTRICT, its facilities and the surrounding community, both criminal and otherwise as deemed necessary by NPD or by mutual agreement between NPD and SCHOOL DISTRICT personnel.
 - 1.4.5. Identify problems focused on children by inspecting SCHOOL DISTRICT schools' area, grounds and property, being watchful for loiterers and suspicious persons or automobiles, frequently visiting high-delinquency areas for law violators, and observing matters conflicting with the best interests of SCHOOL DISTRICT's pupils.
 - 1.4.6. Take part in SCHOOL DISTRICT functions and community projects as deemed necessary by mutual agreement between CITY AND SCHOOL DISTRICT personnel in order to become acquainted with parents, businesspersons and community leaders and to assist in the social and cultural development of pupils, dropouts and recidivists.
 - 1.4.7. Organize law enforcement or related educational programs within the framework of existing SCHOOL DISTRICT programs, as subject to approval by SCHOOL DISTRICT personnel.
 - 1.4.8. In the instance of law violations, serve in the normal police officer capacity to protect life, limb, and property; to prevent crime, to recover stolen and lost property; and to apprehend and prosecute offenders, but in so doing orient activities toward rehabilitation and correction.
 - 1.4.9. Work in cooperation with SCHOOL DISTRICT administrators towards mutually agreed upon goals involving NPD, SCHOOL DISTRICT's schools or its students. The School Resource Officer shall not have disciplinary authority within the school.

- 1.4.10. In the course of performing the duties of this AGREEMENT, respond to emergency calls within the NPD service area when necessary, investigate cases assigned by the Chief of Police, and attend trainings and perform special duties as assigned by the Chief of Police. These responsibilities will require flexibility in the hours that the School Resource Officer works and require the freedom to leave SCHOOL DISTRICT's facilities at various times.
- 1.4.11. Generally, subject to the requirements of Paragraph 1.4.10 above, the School Resource Officer shall spend a minimum of fifty percent (50%) his/her annual hours worked (1040) in or at SCHOOL DISTRICT schools and functions during the school calendar year. If schools in SCHOOL DISTRICT are not in session, the School Resource Officer will function as and perform the duties of a patrol officer for NPD under the direct supervision of the Chief of Police or his designee within the jurisdiction of the City of Northfield. Prior to the start of the school year a schedule will be developed by the Chief of Police or designee in consultation with SCHOOL DISTRICT personal as identified by the Superintendent of Schools.
- 2. RESPONSIBILITY OF SCHOOL DISTRICT. It shall be the responsibility of SCHOOL DISTRICT to:
 - 2.1. Provide guidance and assistance to the School Resource Officer through SCHOOL DISTRICT's principals, teachers, administrative staff, other personnel and student body.
 - 2.2. Provide a private office, desk, and telephone with outside line for use by the School Resource Officer to meet with students and staff on both a public and private meeting basis and to conduct and perform his/her duties as necessary and as otherwise assigned and directed by the Chief of Police.
 - 2.3. Require its principals to coordinate the efforts of the School Resource Officer within the schools.
 - 2.4. Provide clerical help and assistance to the School Resource Officer when needed by the officer within any school at which the officer is working in his/her capacity as School Resource Officer. This includes providing the supplies and materials needed. Clerical help and assistance and supplies and materials will be limited to those duties of the School Resource Officer directly related to law enforcement or related educational programs within the framework of existing SCHOOL DISTRICT programs.
 - 2.5. Provide an assessment of the services received under this AGREEMENT to CITY, if requested by CITY.
- 3. RESPONSIBILITY OF CITY. It is the intention of CITY to provide a School Resource Officer to SCHOOL DISTRICT, and it shall be the responsibility of CITY to:

- 3.1. Assign one licensed peace officer to SCHOOL DISTRICT to act as School Resource Officer at SCHOOL DISTRICT's schools.
- 3.2. Provide NPD equipment needed by the School Resource Officer to perform necessary functions and duties.
- 3.3. Provide training and education within the scope of NPD.
- 3.4. Provide temporary replacements for the School Resource Officer as deemed necessary by NPD.

4. CONSIDERATION.

- 4.1. SCHOOL DISTRICT shall pay CITY the sum of \$24,926 for the period of January 1, 2019, through June 30, 2019. SCHOOL DISTRICT shall pay CITY the sum of \$29,361 for the period of July 1, 2019, through December 31, 2019. SCHOOL DISTRICT shall pay CITY the sum of \$58,722 each year as consideration for CITY's provision of the School Resource Officer for the calendar years of 2020 and 2021, with two equal payments of \$29,361 annually on or before June 1 and December 1, respectively, of each year. The initial payment being made on June 1, 2019 and the final payment on December 1, 2021. CITY shall provide SCHOOL DISTRICT an invoice for the amount owing and payable to CITY at least thirty (30) days in advance of the respective dates upon which payment by SCHOOL DISTRICT is required to be made.
- 5. TERM. The term of this AGREEMENT is for THREE (3) years and shall be effective as of January 1, 2019 and shall continue to December 31, 2021. This AGREEMENT shall be in effect as determined above unless terminated by either party. Termination of this AGREEMENT by either party shall be effective by delivering to the other party a preliminary written notice of termination not less than ninety (90) days prior to the date of termination of the AGREEMENT. All payments due under this AGREEMENT shall be prorated in the event of such termination.

6. INDEMNIFICATION.

6.1. As a condition of CITY's assignment of a School Resource Officer pursuant to this AGREEMENT, SCHOOL DISTRICT agrees to and shall indemnify, protect, save, hold harmless and insure CITY, and its respective officers, directors, employees and members and agents, from and against any and all claims and demands for, or litigation with respect to, all damages which may arise out of or be caused by SCHOOL DISTRICT or its agents, employees, contractors or subcontractors with respect to SCHOOL DISTRICT's performance of its obligations under this AGREEMENT. SCHOOL DISTRICT shall defend CITY against the foregoing, or litigation in connection with the foregoing, at SCHOOL DISTRICT's expense, with counsel reasonably acceptable to CITY. CITY, at its expense, shall have the right to participate in the defense of any claims or litigation and shall have the right to approve any settlement, which approval shall not be unreasonably withheld. The indemnification provision of this Section shall

- not apply to damages or other losses proximately caused by or resulting from the gross negligence or willful misconduct of CITY. All indemnification obligations shall survive termination, expiration or cancellation of this AGREEMENT.
- 6.2. CITY agrees to and shall indemnify, protect, save harmless and insure SCHOOL DISTRICT, and its respective officers, directors, employees and members and agents, from and against any and all claims and demands for, or litigation with respect to, all damages which may arise out of or be caused by CITY or its agents, employees, contractors or subcontractors with respect to CITY's performance of its obligations under this AGREEMENT. CITY shall defend SCHOOL DISTRICT against the foregoing, or litigation in connection with the foregoing, at CITY's expense, with counsel reasonably acceptable to SCHOOL DISTRICT. SCHOOL DISTRICT, at its expense, shall have the right to participate in the defense of any Claims or litigation and shall have the right to approve any settlement, which approval shall not be unreasonably withheld. The indemnification provision of this Section shall not apply to damages or other losses proximately caused by or resulting from the gross negligence or willful misconduct of SCHOOL DISTRICT. All indemnification obligations shall survive termination, expiration or cancellation of this AGREEMENT.
- 7. VOLUNTARY AND KNOWING ACTION. The PARTIES, by executing this AGREEMENT, state that they have carefully read this AGREEMENT and understand fully the contents thereof; that in executing this AGREEMENT they voluntarily accept all terms described in this AGREEMENT without duress, coercion, undue influence, or otherwise, and that they intend to be legally bound thereby.
- 8. AUTHORIZED SIGNATORIES. The PARTIES each represent and warrant to the other that (1) the persons signing this AGREEMENT are authorized signatories for the entities represented, and (2) no further approvals, actions or ratifications are needed for the full enforceability of this AGREEMENT against it; each party indemnifies and holds the other harmless against any breach of the foregoing representation and warranty.
- 9. GOVERNING LAW. This AGREEMENT shall be deemed to have been made and accepted in Rice County, Minnesota, and the laws of the State of Minnesota shall govern any interpretations or constructions of this AGREEMENT without regard to its choice of law or conflict of laws principles.
- 10. DATA PRACTICES. The PARTIES acknowledge that this AGREEMENT is subject to the requirements of Minnesota's Government Data Practices Act, Minnesota Statutes, Section 13.01 *et seq.*
- 11. NO WAIVER. Any Party's failure in any one or more instances to insist upon strict performance of any of the terms and conditions of this AGREEMENT or to exercise any right herein conferred shall not be construed as a waiver or relinquishment of that right or of that Party's right to assert or rely upon the terms and conditions of this AGREEMENT. Any express waiver of a term of this AGREEMENT shall not be binding and effective unless made in writing and properly executed by the waiving Party.

- 12. AMENDMENTS. This AGREEMENT may not be amended except in writing properly executed by the PARTIES hereto. Except as specifically amended, this AGREEMENT shall remain in full force and effect.
- 13. ASSIGNMENT. This AGREEMENT may not be assigned by either Party without the written consent of the other Party.
- 14. SEVERABILITY. The invalidity or unenforceability of any provision of this AGREEMENT shall not affect the validity or enforceability of any other provision. Any invalid or unenforceable provision shall be deemed severed from this AGREEMENT to the extent of its invalidity or unenforceability, and this AGREEMENT shall be construed and enforced as if the AGREEMENT did not contain that particular provision to the extent of its invalidity or unenforceability.
- 15. ENTIRE AGREEMENT. These terms and conditions constitute the entire agreement between the PARTIES regarding the subject matter hereof. All discussions and negotiations are deemed merged in this AGREEMENT. The headings to the various sections of this AGREEMENT are solely for the convenience of the PARTIES, are not part of the AGREEMENT and shall not be used for the interpretation of the validity of the AGREEMENT or any provision hereof.
- 16. SURVIVABILITY. All covenants, indemnities, guarantees, releases, representations and warranties by any Party or PARTIES, and any undischarged obligations of CITY and SCHOOL DISTRICT arising prior to the expiration of this AGREEMENT (whether by completion or earlier termination), shall survive such expiration.
- 17. EXECUTION. This AGREEMENT may be executed simultaneously in two or more counterparts that, when taken together, shall be deemed an original and constitute one and the same document. The signature of any Party to the counterpart shall be deemed a signature to the AGREEMENT, and may be appended to, any other counterpart. Facsimile transmission of executed signature pages shall be deemed as originals and sufficient to bind the executing Party.

Establishing Combined Polling Places for Potential 2019 Special Election as Required by Law Matt Hillmann, Ed.D., Superintendent of Schools | December 10, 2018

A new election law from the 2017 Legislative Session requires school districts to approve a resolution to combine polling places in the event the school district were to hold a special election. This resolution must be approved by December 31 of each year, whether the school district intends to hold a special election or not. The Board must designate the combined polling places they would use in the future calendar year and notify county auditors by sending them a copy of the resolution.

Combined polling places must be a location currently designated for use by a county or municipality. To be clear, the District does not plan to administer a special election in 2019 but is required by law to adopt the resolution on an annual basis.

In 2017, the Board of Education adopted an approach to combine polling places into eight locations. After further review, it appears the District would have difficulty managing eight precincts on its own. Shortages in election judges, lean District Office staffing, and increased costs would be substantial challenges in managing such an election. The following approach was successfully managed by the District for the 2011 operating levy election.

FOR MULTIPLE PRECINCTS AND DESIGNATING HOURS DURING WHICH THE POLLING PLACES WILL REMAIN OPEN FOR VOTING FOR SCHOOL DISTRICT ELECTIONS NOT HELD ON THE DAY OF A STATEWIDE ELECTION

BE IT RESOLVED by the School Board of Independent School District No.659, State of Minnesota, as follows:

- 1. Pursuant to Minnesota Statutes, Section 205A.11, the precincts and polling places for school district elections are those precincts or parts of precincts located within the boundaries of the school district which have been established by the cities or towns located in whole or in part within the school district. The board hereby confirms those precincts and polling places so established by those municipalities.
- 2. Pursuant to Minnesota Statutes, Section 205A.11, the board may establish a combined polling place for several precincts for school district elections not held on the day of a statewide election. Each combined polling place must be a polling place that has been designated by a county or municipality. The following combined polling places are established to serve the precincts specified for all school district special and general elections not held on the same day as a statewide election:

This combined polling place serves all territory in Independent School District No. 659 located in Castle Rock Township; Eureka Township; Greenvale Township; Sciota Township; Waterford Township; and the City of Northfield, Ward 3, Precinct 2; Dakota County, Minnesota.

Combined Polling Place:

St. John's Lutheran Church 500 Third Street West Northfield, Minnesota

This combined polling place serves all territory in Independent School District No. 659 located in Webster Township Precinct 1 and Precinct 2; the City of Northfield, Ward 3, Precinct 1; the City of Northfield, Ward 4, Precinct 2; Rice County, Minnesota.

Combined Polling Place:

Northfield Community Resource Center

1651 Jefferson Parkway Northfield, Minnesota

This combined polling place serves all territory in Independent School District No. 659 located in Bridgewater Township; Forest Township; Erin Township; the City of Dundas; Cannon City Township; and the City of Northfield, Ward 2, Precinct 2; Rice County, Minnesota.

First United Church of Christ

300 Union Street Northfield, Minnesota

This combined polling place serves all territory in Independent School District No. 659 located in the City of Northfield, Ward 1, Precinct 1; and the City of Northfield, Ward 1, Precinct 2; Rice County, Minnesota.

Combined Polling Place:

United Methodist Church 1401 South Maple Street Northfield, Minnesota

This combined polling place serves all territory in Independent School District No. 659 located in Northfield Township; Rice County, Minnesota; the City of Dennison; Rice County, Minnesota; the City of Dennison; Goodhue County, Minnesota; Warsaw Township; Goodhue County, Minnesota; and the City of Northfield, Ward 2, Precinct 1; Rice County, Minnesota.

- 3. Pursuant to Minnesota Statutes, Section 205A.09, the polling places will remain open for voting for school district elections not held on the same day as a statewide election between the hours of 7 o'clock a.m. and 8:00 o'clock p.m.
- 4. The clerk is directed to file a certified copy of this resolution with the county auditors of each of the counties in which the school district is located, in whole or in part, within thirty (30) days after its adoption.
- 5. As required by Minnesota Statutes, Section 204B.16, Subdivision 1a, the clerk is hereby authorized and directed to give written notice of new polling place locations to each affected household with at least one registered voter in the school district whose school district polling place location has been changed. The notice must be a nonforwardable notice mailed at least twenty-five (25) days before the date of the first election to which it will apply. A notice that is returned as undeliverable must be forwarded immediately to the appropriate county auditor, who shall change the registrant's status to "challenged" in the statewide registration system.

(If a combined polling place is changed, the change must be adopted at least ninety (90) days prior to the first election where it will be used unless that polling place has become unavailable for use.)
