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## News from the Principal

Welcome to new and returning Middle School families:

Summer is a time to slow down and enjoy some extended time with family and friends. Whether it is taking a vacation, hanging out at the pool/lake or just spending time with family and friends around Northfield, summer has a different feel than the school year. Enjoy these times and don't take them for granted for each summer creates memories that last a lifetime.

Now that we have hit August, I am beginning the process of getting ready for the 2018-19 school year. I am not wishing our final month of summer away, only placing a few items on everyone's radar.

The first item is for grade 7 students only. It is a state requirement that all students entering grade 7 have up to date immunizations before they can start school. Every year this sneaks up on families and we have a large number of students who are endanger of beginning their grade 7 year on the first day. Do your best to make this a priority and check it off your summer list sooner rather than later (see specifics on page 10 in the newsletter).

The next item is for all three grades. Families are again asked to purchase iPad insurance. The cost is \$20, with an adjusted fee for families who qualify for free or reduced meals. This insurance is important to protect families from being charged for fixing or replacing a damaged iPad. These fees have typically run between \$100-\$400 and last year the middle school saw a large increase in students damaging their iPads. In addition, start talking with your students about taking care of their district iPad during the school year and as parents, please do a visual check on a regular basis.

Finally, I am asking families to not lose sight of **PRIDE** over the summer. Summer has its own unique opportunities to discuss what **PRIDE** looks like. It may come up on the athletic field, the community pool, shopping downtown or even around the house. We believe that being **Prepared**, showing **Respect**, having **Integrity**, being **Dependable** and showing **Excellence** is not just reserved for during the school day, but a way of life. Be looking to catch your students showing **PRIDE** and point it out. Doing this is important and together we are making a difference in our student's lives that will stay with them beyond their middle school years.

The 6th Grade WEB Orientation begins with a large group assembly. 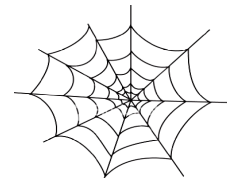

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## Attendance: (507) 663-0655

**Please call the 24-hour attendance line or email Jen Henriksen, each day that your child is absent. You may reach the attendance line at (507) 663-0655 or emailing [jhenriksen@northfieldschools.org](mailto:jhenriksen@northfieldschools.org).**

Emailing teachers **DOES NOT** count as official notification for state attendance records. When calling or emailing the absence, please leave your student's name, grade, reason for absence, and your relationship to the child. If calling or emailing an illness, please leave information regarding symptoms. Our health services staff is required to file a report with the State Health Department if there is an unusual increase in certain illnesses. Students who are not called in or emailed to Jen Henriksen, will be considered unex-

cused until a parent/guardian notifies us. If you should forget to call in, your child may turn in a note to the attendance window outside the office when he/she returns to school. Students may not call in their own absences.

If a parent knows of a student's extended absence in advance, the absence should be called into the attendance line or emailed to Jen Henriksen. Students should also connect with their teachers to assure any missed work will be posted to Schoology. Students are responsible for completing all work posted to Schoology. Students returning from an extended absence will need to schedule arrangements with the teacher for completing any work that could not be completed during the absence. Homework will not

be collected in the office for a student prior to absence.

**Parents** call attendance line 507-663-0655 or email Jen Henriksen at [jhenriksen@northfieldschools.org](mailto:jhenriksen@northfieldschools.org) to report the absence.

**Students** contact the teacher to assure that any missed work will be posted to Schoology and schedule arrangements to make up the work.

### What is Schoology and how do students get access?

Schoology is Northfield Public Schools learning management system that connects students with adults and their classes. At the Middle School, we use Schoology to send students important information about what is coming up, get feedback on different topics. Students are able to communicate with teachers, pull up homework, take quizzes, submit assignments and much more from anywhere they have internet access. Schoology is a web based program that can be accessed from any computer, iPad or phone.

Logging in is easy. Students go to [Schoology.com](https://www.schoology.com), click "Log In" and enter their school e-mail and password. Forgot your e-mail or password? Not a problem.

All students school e-mail addresses are their **first name.last name@northfieldschools.org** and passwords are the **first 4 letters of their first name** and **four digit lunch code** (*does not change from year to year*).

### Family Access / Skylert Messages

Family Access student data system involves parents in the education process and allows the District to provide information as soon as it becomes available. Parents can view their student's attendance with a convenient calendar, access a detailed class schedule, and look at food purchases and balances online. Parents can also view grade book information

with test, assignment, and quiz scores for their students.

Additionally, Family Access is where you would sign up for Skylert messages. The Skylert system is used to send a weekly parent message from the Middle School as well as emergency communications and meal account notices.

**To apply for a Family Access login and password**, go to the district's website at [www.northfieldschools.org](https://www.northfieldschools.org) and click on **Family Access link**. At the bottom of the screen, click on "Apply Now". Fill out the form, and login information will be e-mailed to you.

## Middle School Athletics and Academic Activities

The Middle School offers both academic and athletic activities in the fall for students, such as: Boys/Girls Soccer (grades 7-8), Football (grades 6-8), Volleyball (grades 6-8), Girls Tennis (grades 6-8), Math League (grades 6-8) and Knowledge Bowl (grades 6-8). Registration for these activities can be done online at <http://northfieldschools.org>, click on the red clipboard icon, middle school payments, and then activities payment. You will then be asked to create an account. Registration will be the first week of August. If you have any questions regarding activities registration, please contact Jen Henriksen at [jhenriksen@northfieldschools.org](mailto:jhenriksen@northfieldschools.org) or 507-663-0680. Students cannot participate until registration and payment is complete. We will have schedules, correspondence from the coaches, and Schooloo-gy codes available in the office after August 20th.

Grade 7-8 football practices will start on **August 27** and run through **Thursday, August 30, from 4:00-5:30 pm.** There will be an "Open Shed" equipment pickup from the coaches on **Thursday, August 23 from 5:00-7:00 pm, and on Friday, August 24 from 9:00 am – 12:00 pm.** Please pick up your football equipment from either session to help practices run smoothly on the 27<sup>th</sup>. The normal football practice schedule will resume with the start of school on **Tuesday, September 4**, with practices running **Monday through Friday, 3:15-4:45 pm.**

Boys/Girls Soccer, 6<sup>th</sup> grade Football, Volleyball, and Girls' Tennis practices will begin on the first day of school, **Tuesday, September 4. Practices will run Monday through Friday, 3:00-4:30 pm.** Grade 6 football and volleyball will not have practice on Fridays.

Math League and Knowledge Bowl will start towards the end of September. Practices will run from **3:00-4:30 pm**, once a week. Please watch for more detailed information regarding practices dates and times the second week of school during our daily school announcements, parent skylerts, or paper copies that can be found outside the main office.

## Cell Phones and Electronics

Cellular phone use is prohibited during school hours at the Middle School. All cell phones should be turned off prior to entering the academic wings. The expectation for cell phones is that they are not needed between the times of 7:45 am to 2:51 pm. If there is a need for a student to have a cell phone at school, staff should not hear it or see it. It should be put in a locker during the day.

**Cell phones are not permitted in classrooms, during transition times, or in the lunchroom between 7:45 am and 2:51 pm.** If any staff member sees a phone out in classrooms, during transition times, or in the lunchroom, it will be labeled and taken to the office. The phone can be picked up after 2:51 pm. Additionally, video recording students or staff without their consent is prohibited at Northfield Middle School.

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## Knowledge Bowl

Junior High Knowledge Bowl is the Middle School's newest academic activity. All middle school students (grades 6-8) are able to participate in this activity which involves competition from other schools in the Southeast Region of the Minnesota Service Cooperative. During the contest, teams of students compete in written and oral rounds by answering questions related to all areas of learning, typical of secondary educational programs. Questions test students recall, problem solving, and criti-

cal thinking skills. This competition provides a format for student growth centered around academics. Teams consist of six students (6 competing in the written round and 5 competing in each oral round).

Northfield teams will compete in Round Robin competitions at the Southeast Service Cooperative (SSC) once in October, November and December. Each team then competes in a Sub-Regional competi-

tion and the top twelve teams from each tier advance to Regionals in January. We will start forming our team in mid-September, soon after the start of school. Please let me know of any questions you have about Knowledge Bowl and Northfield Middle School.

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## Math League

Northfield Middle School's Math League program is part of the the Minnesota Junior High School Mathematics League, whose purpose is to encourage students to participate in math contests, serve as a "farm club" for the MSHSML (high school program), enable students to meet mathletes from other schools, and to provide recognition for students excelling in mathematics.

Our NMS teams belong to a division with 5 other schools - Kenyon-Wanamingo, Goodhue, Mazeppa, Zumbrota, & Cannon Falls. Each meet has three parts to it:

two timed individual tests and one timed team test. Mathletes' individual scores are recorded throughout the season and awards are presented at the last meet in January. Team scores are also recorded and acknowledged at the end of the season.

Practice sessions are on Mondays from September 24 through the final meet in January. These practice sessions are from 3:00 - 4:00, and are used to review competition questions from previous years in preparation for upcoming meets.

There are five competitions per year that occur on Mondays after school at Kenyon-Wanamingo. Transportation is provided to and from the event.

The meets for this coming school year are 10/8, 10/29, 11/19, 12/10, and 1/7.

## Nurse Notes

Information for all NMS students/parents/guardians:

Summer is a good time to get dental/vision exams and physicals/immunization review scheduled before the start of the next school year! Minnesota State Immunization Law states all students who attend public schools must provide the required immunizations OR a Legal Exemption. Students who are non-compliant will not be allowed to attend school according to MN law.

\*This law pertains to all students but 7<sup>th</sup> grade is most affected. Requirements for incoming 7<sup>th</sup> grade are: all childhood shots and an updated Tdap, Meningitis-MCV and 2 varicella or proof of Chickenpox. Rice County Public Health provides immunizations for those who qualify. See Minnesota Department of Health website for more information on immunizations and disease.

\*Middle School students who will be participating in High School Sports are

required to have a sport physical on file before participating. A copy should be given to both the High School activities office and the NMS nurse office. Sport Physicals are valid for 3 years and must be on the appropriate MN High School League Sport Physical form. Please note: these are not automatically sent from the clinic, you must request a copy and provide it to the nurse office. (Sport physicals are not required for Middle School sports.)

\*Students with specific health needs such as Diabetes, Seizures, Asthma, Severe allergies, etc. will need to provide a care plan/med order from your physician yearly.

\*Students needing administration of medication at school requires a physician order form and signed by the parent/guardian yearly. Medication must be in a properly labeled container. Medication order forms may be printed off of the School District website or picked up in the nurse office during the school year. Parent/guardians will be expected to

deliver their students prescribed daily medications such as Ritalin, Adderall, Anti-depressants, etc. Students may not carry those medications in their school bag. Unclaimed controlled substances will be discarded at the Police Station at the end of the school year.

\* Parents/guardians are responsible for providing their students necessary health supplies, health updates, emergency medication for field trips and daily needs while at school.

The School Nurse office is staffed while school is in session, and only part time the week before school starts. You may mail/FAX 507-663-0660/email or drop off health information for the school year. Please review the emergency phone numbers/contacts you have given the school. Provide updates so that school staff can reach you when needed.

### **IMMUNIZATIONS REQUIRED TO ENTER 7TH GRADE:**

All students entering 7<sup>th</sup> grade in the fall of 2017 must have all required childhood immunizations on file, or a legal exemption, in order to attend public school in Minnesota. Summer is the perfect time to complete immunizations for your student. Contact your local clinic or Rice County Public Health (507-645-9576) to schedule an appointment. Parents may review their student's current health record on Family Access

#### **Required immunizations for students entering 7<sup>th</sup> grade:**

**Tdap (tetanus/diphtheria/pertussis)** – *if they have not had Tdap after their 7<sup>th</sup> birthday, then a new one needs to be given for entrance to 7<sup>th</sup> grade.*

**Varicella vaccine** - *two shots are required if student has never had chicken pox*

**or chicken pox reporting:** only persons who had chickenpox in 2010 or later, must have provider documentation of disease.

Parent may report the disease to the school if before that date.

**Meningococcal (meningitis)**

Please mail (NMS 2200 Division Street South, Northfield, MN 55057), fax (507-663-0660), or deliver immunizations to the NMS Health office **by August 24<sup>th</sup>, 2018**. Students not in compliance with state law will have their iPad disabled or withheld until proper documentation is in place at school.

## Middle School Youth Center (MSYC)

The Middle School Youth Center (MSYC) is a free after-school program, dedicated to fostering in youth a sense of personal engagement with their school, community, and their individual gifts and potential. Located at the Northfield Middle School, the program welcomes Northfield youth in grades 6 to 8. It's open from 3 to 5 p.m., Monday through Thursday, when school is in session.

**Middle School Youth Center will open on Monday, September 24, 2018.**

## **Annual Notifications from the District Office**

### **Student Citizenship Handbook Distributed**

The 2018-2019 Student Citizenship Handbook is distributed to all secondary students on their iPad and the youngest elementary school-aged child in the family.

The handbook includes information regarding expectations for student behavior. The handbook includes a comprehensive list of regulations for student behavior and consequences for misbehavior. Included in the handbook is the district's policies on Bullying, Hazing, Personal Possessions/Lockers, Technology Use, Harassment, Possession of Controlled Substances, Weapons, and Student Use and Parking of Motor Vehicles (including patrols, inspections and searches). Consequences are consistent, but vary depending on the severity of the offense, the student's grade level and previous violations. The handbook also includes a chart that outlines offenses that could possibly lead to expulsion.

The rights and responsibilities detailed in the handbook apply to students in any school, on district property, at school bus stops and at school or district events. Consequences may also apply for misbehaviors that take place at other locations, but which directly affect school programs or activities.

Parents are encouraged to read and review information in the handbook with their student(s) before finding a place to save it for the school year. Teachers will also briefly review information in the handbook with students at the start of the school year.

### **Northfield Public Schools in Compliance with AHERA**

The Asbestos Hazard Emergency Response Act (AHERA) of 1986 requires the district to notify parents annually concerning asbestos-containing building materials in the schools, and that the management plan for each building is available for their review. Federal law requires a periodic walk-through (called "surveillance") every six months of each area containing asbestos. In addition, the law requires all buildings to be re-inspected every three years after a management plan went into effect. IEA (Institute for Environmental Assessment) completed this for the Northfield Public Schools in 2013. For the 2018-19 school year, Northfield Public Schools does not have any asbestos removal projects planned. This past summer, Northfield Public Schools continued the abatement of mercury/asbestos containing flooring at Sibley Elementary School. Any questions concerning this notice or an explanation of our Asbestos Management Plan can be directed to the Director of Buildings and Grounds at 507.663.0610.

*The following notice is published pursuant to Minnesota law, "Parents Right to Know Act."*

Northfield Public Schools recognizes the importance of our students' and employees' health and well-being. Therefore, we are examining and reducing our use of pesticides and utilizing Integrated Pest Management techniques in our school buildings and on school grounds to minimize the possible long-term unknown health effects of pesticides.

Northfield Public Schools will make available, in the school district office, for parents and employees, the estimated schedule of application of pesticides classified by the United States Environmental Protection Agency as designated under the Federal Insecticide, Fungicide and Rodenticide Act. Parents may also request that the school district notify him/her prior to the application of such pesticides on a day different from the days specified in the notice. If a person would like to be notified prior to application, please provide an email address or a name and telephone number to the Buildings & Grounds Department at 507.663.0610.

### **Indoor Air Quality**

Northfield Public Schools continues to improve an indoor air quality management plan for the district. The management plan is based on the Environmental Protection Agencies (EPA) "Tools for Schools." It addresses policies and procedures that will be used in the schools to address indoor air quality issues. The plan's goal is to provide indoor air quality that contributes to a favorable learning environment for students, productivity for teachers and staff, as well as an environment that is as healthy as possible.

### **Indoor Air Quality continued...**

However, the intent of the plan is not to solve all indoor air quality concerns in a school, rather the intent is to provide a road map to assist in managing indoor air quality. The Indoor Air Quality Committee has joined the Health and Safety Committee to review and continually update the management plan. If you have any questions concerning indoor air quality, or would like to see the EPA Tools for Schools checklists, please contact the District Indoor Air Quality Coordinator at 507.663.0610.

### **Special Education Services Available at all Schools**

Federal and state laws guide the school district in identifying, evaluating and serving students with disabilities.

Northfield Public Schools serves students with disabilities from birth through age 21. A team of special educators, general educators and families work together to develop an Individualized Educational Plan (IEP) for students who meet the criteria for services. The IEP team considers the student's present level of performance, identifies educational needs and develops goals to meet those needs. The team determines the educational program that will serve the student in the least restrictive setting.

Northfield Public Schools provides a continuum of services for students with disabilities. Most students receive special education in their neighborhood school. The district also has specialized, center-based programs for students who need more support.

### **District in Compliance with State-Required Background Checks**

Parents and community members are always encouraged to apply as an employee or volunteer at their student's school and/or with Northfield Public Schools. Volunteers provide a valuable service to students and staff. Minnesota Statute requires a school hiring authority to request a criminal history background check on all individuals who are offered employment in a school and on all individuals, except enrolled student volunteers, who are offered the opportunity to provide athletic coaching services or other extracurricular services to a school, regardless of whether any compensation is paid. Parents and community members who volunteer on a regular basis must complete a background check before serving students affiliated with Northfield Public Schools.

### **Data Privacy Practices**

Pursuant to the requirements of state and federal law, the following constitutes Northfield Public Schools Annual Notification to parents and students regarding data privacy practices.

Northfield schools maintain educational records on all students to help plan the student's educational program, communicate with parents/guardians, and comply with state regulations. Student records include information such as standardized achievement and ability test data, grades, attendance records, health/medical records and evaluation by professional staff.

Except in limited circumstances authorized by law, most information from student records will not be released to members of the public without the written permission of the student's parent or guardian, or of the student, if he or she is 18 or older.

District policy guarantees parents/guardians (and students 18 and older) the right to examine the contents of their own student's records except those items that are, by state or federal law, made confidential.

Parents/guardians (and students 18 and older) have the right to challenge the accuracy of these records and also the right to authorize or deny release of records requested by a third party.

The district forwards educational records of students to other schools and school districts in which the student seeks or intends to enroll upon request of that school or school district. Parents are not notified prior to this transfer.

This review of the data privacy rights of students in the educational records maintained by Northfield Public Schools is intended only to be a summary of the district policy and applicable state and federal law. ## Notice of Designation of Directory Information

School districts are required by state and federal law to notify parents and students that certain information contained in a student's education record may be made public without prior written consent. The Northfield Public Schools designates the following as "directory information" and may, in accordance with the Minnesota Data Practices Act, release the following directory information without permission unless the district has been notified that it should not be released.

- Student's name, address, telephone number
- Parent's name, address, telephone number
- Student's date of birth
- Student's major field of study
- Student's dates of school attendance, grade level completed, enrollment status
- Student's participation in officially recognized activities/sports
- Student's height and weight, if a member of an athletic team
- Middle and High School Student Athletic Physical Examination Expiration Date
- Student's degrees, honors and awards received
- Student's most recent educational agency or institution attended
- Student's photograph(s), videotapes and other visual representations for school-approved publications, yearbooks, newspapers, public presentations and web pages.

A parent/guardian of a student or an eligible student (18 years of age or older) may object to the listed directory information being disclosed without the parent/guardian or eligible student's prior written consent except to school officials as provided under federal law. In order to make all directory information private, the parent/guardian or eligible student must submit a completed Denial of Release of Directory Information (Appendix C to Policy 515-Protection and Privacy of Pupil Records) to your student's building principal or the Superintendent of Schools. This designation will remain in effect for the current school year only.

Federal and state laws require all school districts to provide military recruiters, upon request, with the name, address and telephone number of all 11<sup>th</sup> and 12<sup>th</sup> grade students within 60 days after the date of the request unless the parent or eligible student (students over 18 years old and not a dependent) requests that the information not be provided without written permission. If you do not want Northfield Public Schools to release your student's name, address and telephone number to a military recruiter, you must complete Appendix D (Denial of Release of Information to Military Recruiters) to Policy 515-Protection and Privacy of Pupil Records. Please note that if you previously submitted a Denial of Release of Directory Information (Appendix C), it alone will not be sufficient. The law requires that a specific denial of access to military recruiters be made. **In order to make all directory information about a student private to the public in general, including military recruiting officers, the parent/guardian or eligible student must complete Appendix C and Appendix D.**
