

# Course Request Registration Steps for the 2025-2026 School Year

***Please read the following directions carefully and enter your course and alternate course requests in Skyward by 3:00 on Friday, February 7, 2025.***

## **Pre-Planning**

1. Review graduation requirements and grade level course requirements on the "[NHS Four Year Plan Grid for the Classes of 2028 and 2029](#)" or the "[NHS Four Year Plan Grid for Classes 2026 and 2027](#)" (and below)
2. Consult the [2025-26 Course Registration Guide](#) for course descriptions, prerequisites and career pathway information
3. Use the [Course List](#) (below) for course numbers that you will use to enter requests in your STUDENT Skyward account
4. Discuss course options with current teachers, parents/guardians, and your counselor. For simple questions, email or send a Schoology message to your counselor. For more complex questions, set up an individual meeting during a study hall, or a zoom meeting on your virtual learning days.

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## **Schedule Change Policy**

*Schedules are difficult to adjust once the master schedule is created based on student course requests in the spring. If a scheduling conflict occurs, one or more student-selected alternate courses will be added to student schedules as necessary. If a schedule change is necessary for graduation or in order to carry at least six classes (3.0 credits), students can initiate these changes on the designated schedule change day the week before school begins. Once the school year begins, the only allowed changes will be to drop a class for a study hall if there are seven classes in place or to add a class that is for required graduation credits.*

*Students who have seven classes on their schedule and drop one in order to take a study hall must do so before the mid-quarter at the start of the semester, which is approximately four weeks into the semester. All other required changes will be complete by the end of the fifth day of the semester. Students may not have two study halls/open hours (Senior Transition, TA) in the same semester. **Dropping a course after the deadline results in a failing semester grade for the class.***

## **Entering Course Requests and Alternates:**

1. [Log into Skyward](#) using your **STUDENT** username and password; if you use the Skyward App, go to the full desktop version after logging in. You will not be able to register using a parent log-in.
2. At the left side of the screen, click **Schedule**.
3. On the top right, click **Request Courses for 2025-2026 in Northfield High School**.
4. Click the Request Courses tab at the top.
5. Scroll through the list of available courses in the left box and click on a desired course.
6. Click the **Add Course** between the boxes, and the desired course will appear in the right box.
7. Be sure to first add required courses for your grade level.
8. Continue adding until all desired credit-earning courses appear in the box on the right and your credit total for the year just above the right box is accurate. Remember to add all credit-earning courses—both semester and full year. **You will not be able to register for study halls; they will be automatically added in your open hours if you sign up for less than 7 credits.**
9. If you make a mistake, highlight the course in the right box and click the **Remove Course** tab between the boxes.
10. Click the **Request Alternates** tab at the top and follow the same procedure as described above until all alternate courses appear in the box on the right. Alternate courses are identified in the Priority column with numbers.
11. When all of your course requests and alternate requests appear in the right box, click the red X at the top right of the box; your requests will be automatically saved.

## Course Request & Registration

### Frequently Asked Questions

- **How do I register for a study hall?**
    - You don't. You only enroll in the credit-earning courses you want to take. Open hours are automatically filled with study halls.
  - **If I take a study hall, will I still be able to graduate on time?**
    - Yes, assuming that you are passing all of your classes each semester. If you have ANY classes you have not passed, talk to your counselor about your situation.
  - **What if I'm not sure about needing a study hall?**
    - Sign up for 7 credits knowing that you have until the mid-quarter point to drop an elective and add a study hall in its place. That gives you almost four weeks to experience your schedule without a study hall and determine if you need one.
  - **What if I change my mind about courses?**
    - If it's before the end of this school year, talk to your counselor RIGHT AWAY.
    - If it's after the school year ends, you will not be able to make changes. Your initial requests will be followed - including your alternates!
  - **How do I make up credits for a class or classes I have not passed?**
    - Talk to your counselor. There are ways during the school day, outside of the school day, and during the summer!
  - **How do I register for PSEO classes?**
    - After you have selected a full NHS course load (6.0-7.0 credits) for next year, you may apply and register directly through the individual college. Check page 11 of the Course Registration Guide, attend the PSEO Info Session during FLEX on Monday, February 24, and talk to your counselor for more information.
  - **How do I know if I should take an AP course?**
    - Talk to your current teacher in that subject area. Talk to the AP teacher for the course you are considering. Talk to your counselor.
  - **Where do I learn about any new classes that will be offered at NHS next year?**
    - Check the table of contents on pages 1-2 in the Course Registration Guide. "NEW" appears after every new course, and a complete course description is included on the identified page.
  - **One of the courses I want to take isn't listed in Skyward when I scroll through the course options. What do I do?**
    - Verify on the master course list that the course is actually available to your grade level. If it is, then contact your counselor for help.
  - **What happens if I don't enter any alternate course choices?**
    - If there's a schedule conflict, your counselor will choose a replacement course for you based on what is available.
    - It is in your best interest to enter alternate course choices.
  - **What if I sign up for an advanced or honors level course and my current grades drop below the requirements to be in the class?**
    - You will be moved from the advanced level course to the regular level course.
  - **You keep saying, "Talk to your counselor." HOW?!**
