Robinson. These two storylines converge by the end of the novel revealing themes

of loss of innocence, racial prejudice, justice, courage, and gender stereotypes.


It isn't until the end of the story that Scout realizes what Atticus is trying to teach


her: "You never really understand a person until you consider things from their


point of view."





There are lots of opportunities in place for homework help and assistance. Talk to us or your student's counselor!!







8th Grade Science-2nd Semester

Eighth grade science continues with a focus on Earth and Space Science. We have completed our unit on the scientific method and our two units on chemistry. We


should wrap up our astronomy unit some time in February and from there we will take a closer look at Earth. Our first unit in Geology will explore the interior of Earth and plate tectonics. Then we will study other forces, like weathering and erosion, that shape Earth. We will take a closer look at minerals and the three types of rock that make up Earth. And finally, as part of our Geology segment of this course, we will learn about Earth's ancient history. The last few weeks of science will be dedicated to meteorology where we will better understand the difference between weather and climate, learn about factors that affect both weather and climate and take a close look at how our actions are causing our planet to warm.

-Human Geography -Population -Economics -Asia -Africa -Europe -Australia -Global Issues


