

## News from the Principal

Middle School Families:

At the time I am writing all of you, we are watching yet another possible weather issue approaching us. Because of this, I find it most appropriate to speak about our pilot flexible learning days that we have rolled out this winter.

The thinking about flexible learning days is that even though we are clearly not replicating a regular school day, the hope is that student learning is greater than it would be in June, if we added days to our calendar. Only time will tell if this is a good plan or if adding days to the end of the school year is the better option. However, either way I want to thank you for being willing to partner with us in an effort to keep learning moving forward, even on days we cannot attend.

Flexible learning days do come with some challenges we need to work through. The first is how to handle students who do not have access to technology outside the school day. Our first attempt at allowing these students the same or similar opportunity is to allow students three days to complete assignments after we return to classes. Some other pieces to this that we are still working through are, students procrastinating to complete the assignments given and evaluating the additional workload for students who did not have technology access. This pilot is a work in progress. With student, family, and staff feedback we hope a plan to support all our students through unexpected school cancelations will fall into place.

How can we strengthen this partnership during flexible learning days? The first way is to encourage your student to communicate with their teachers and then follow up and make sure it happened. Secondly, sitting down and having them show you the assignments on Schoology that they need to complete or showing you what they accomplished when you get home from work. Finally, sit down and help your student map out a plan on how and when they will get all the work completed and then checking in to see if they are on track.

I would love to be writing you and saying we will not have another flexible learning day this year, but the odds are we will. My goal is to do my best to support all of you and our teachers as they do their best to create assignments that will keep the learning process going.

I would like to thank you for having such amazing students and the incredible support you show the middle school. Please take some time to read through this newsletter and know we are here to support all of you.

### **Nurse Notes**

**ATTENTION 6th Grade students**: Minnesota State Immunization Law requires the following immunizations before entering 7th grade in the fall of 2019. Please provide a copy for the Health office when shots are given so your health records can be updated at school.

- Tdap, a new one needs to be given unless they had one after their 7th birthday.
- 2 Varicella vaccines OR proof of Chickenpox
- Meningitis (meningococcal)
- All childhood vaccines must be on file OR, provide a Legal Exemption, This must be notarized or signed by your physician, if a medical exemption.

You may schedule your immunization appointment now with your clinic. Get them done early since supplies become limited in August.

#### Influenza (Flu)

Is a contagious disease that spreads by coughing, sneezing and close contact? It is caused by the influenza viruses. Vac-

cines are available to help prevent this illness.

quires the following immunizations before symptoms are: fever 100 or higher/chills, sore throat, muscle aches, fatigue, cough, headache, congestion.

Good hand washing with soap and water is the best defense against spreading unwanted illness. **\*\*When calling in your sick child on the attendance line, please list symptoms of illness.** 

#### Strep

Signs and symptoms you may have: Sudden onset of sore throat Fever/nausea/vomiting/stomachache Bad headache Inflammation of throat, tonsils, enlarged cervical lymph nodes. May have skin rash.

A throat culture is necessary for diagnosis and antibiotics are prescribed for treatment. May return to school after 24 hours of antibiotics, fever free and feeling better.

#### Medication

For prescription medication to be given at school, a completed School Medication Administration Form must be on file. The name of the medication, dose, time of day, and a parent & physician signature is required. School staff may not administer

any prescription medication without this on file or another dose that is not listed on the medication form.

#### Injuries/Surgery/Special health care

In the event that your student would have an injury, require surgery or have any special health care needs, please contact the school nurse and a health care plan can be set up for accommodations while at school. Please provide a physician note with the diagnosis and their recommendations for activities/gym.

## Safety

**Reminder for a safe AM drop off and PM pick up at NMS:** Thank you to all families for pulling as far forward in the loop area before letting your students out in the morning and picking them up in the afternoon. We want to be sure that all of our students and staff are safe when entering/exiting vehicles, so please remember to **drive slowly**. Only use the inside lane around the loop if you are parking, and pull your vehicle all the way around before dropping off or picking up passengers.

For our walking families, please stress the importance of staying in the crosswalks and not entering them until the crossing guard tells them it is safe. With winter in our future, a little extra time and patience will be needed to make sure we stay accident free.









## **Cell Phones and Electronics**

Cellular phone use is prohibited during school hours at the Middle School. All cell phones should be turned off prior to entering the academic wings and not visible during or between classes. Students who do not follow this policy could have one or more of the following consequences:

- Cell phone will be confiscated until the end of the day.
- Parent will need to pick up the cell phone in the office.

Please call the 24-hour attendance line or email Jen Henriksen, each day that your child is absent. You may reach the attendance line at 663-0655 or emailing <u>jhenrik-</u> sen@northfieldschools.org.

E-mailing teachers <u>DOES NOT</u> count as official notification for state attendance records. When calling or emailing the attendance, please leave your student's name, grade, reason for absence and your relationship to the child. If calling or emailing an illness, please leave information regarding symptoms. Our health services staff is required to file a report with the State Health Department if there is an unusual increase in certain illnesses. Students who are not called in or emailed to Jen Henriksen, will be considered unexcused until a parent/ guardian notifies us. If you should forget to call in, your child may turn in a note to the attendance window outside the office when he/she returns to school. Students may not call in their own absences.

If a parent knows of a student's extended absence in advance, the absence should be called into the attendance line or emailed to Jen Henriksen. Students should also connect with their teachers to assure any missed work will be posted to Schoology. Students are responsible for completing all work posted to Schoology. Students returning from an extended absence will need to schedule arrangements with the teacher for completing any work that could not be completed during the absence. Homework will not be collected in the office for a student prior to absence.
