
of the grade art students started the year creating Personality Blobs out of Oil Pastel. The blobs were installed together in a collaborative artwork!


Students also spent time designing a cover for their sketchbook out of patterns and designs.

As we head into Quarter 3, students are working on their Personality Pots!






Students started the year by creating a This is Me... Drawing. A simple yet powerful mini visual autobiography.

We then transitioned into learning about our brains and the growing research revolving around left brain and right brain thinking/processing, based on the popular book by Betty **Edwards' "Drawing on the Right Side** of the Brain. They learned about drawing up-side down, with the Upside down Picasso. Breaking subjects down into lines, shapes, angles, etc... all of which are visual terms.





They transitioned into drawing beautiful hand drawings using pencil. This project allowed them to develop their understanding of value and composition and gave them a great opportunity to reinforce the visual terms recently discussed.


