I hope you had an enjoyable long weekend! This fall is really flying by! This newsletter serves as an update on all things orchestra related.

#### What have we been working on in class?

7th Grade orchestra students are continuing to work on our new finger pattern of high 3s and extensions. This is a challenging pattern to play in tune - we will be working on these new notes for several more weeks.

#### **Orchestra Lessons**

Students will receive their 2nd Quarter lesson schedules this week during their lesson time. We will spend a day in class recording them in our planners and setting up reminders using Google Calendar.

As a reminder, if a student misses a lesson, it is not a problem. There are make-up opportunities available! Please encourage your student to contact me right away if a lesson was missed. It is best to make-up a lesson sooner rather than later.

## Practice Expectations

Practicing at home is the most important thing a student can do to be successful and a contributing member of the orchestra. If practicing at home is challenging, students can also use practice rooms in the music area during study halls and before or after school. Practicing is the majority of the homework for orchestra students. The <u>minimum</u> practice goal for 7th grade is 4 times per week, 15 minutes each time. Once a student starts playing, this 15 minute goal is usually quite easy to attain. Students received a new practice sheet last week.

## NMS Music T-shirts and Concert Dress

Orchestra students will receive their NMS Music T-shirt later this week (if one was ordered). When receiving their new shirt, I will make sure that it fits and will write each student's initials on the shirt tag. With hundreds of NMS Music shirts being passed out this week, we want to make sure that your student's shirt is not misplaced before getting home!

As a reminder, orchestra students will wear this Music T-shirt <u>for all performances</u>. Shirts will be worn <u>tucked-in</u> to either black pants or a black skirt. For students choosing to wear a skirt, the skirt must cover the student's knees when sitting. Black yoga pants or leggings are only appropriate as concert attire <u>if</u> a skirt is worn over them. Shoes for performances are black with a closed toe. These details can also be found in the Orchestra Syllabus.

## **Concert Information**

Our first orchestra concert is on Monday, December 16! This will be an exciting evening with lots of music! There are 2 performance times on that night. Each orchestra is assigned a time to perform (see below). Students are expected to arrive 30 minutes prior to the concert time and stay throughout their concert time. Students will watch 1-2 other orchestras perform.
