Informational Meeting

All registrants and those interested in participating are highly encouraged to attend the Ski and Snowboard Club meeting on Monday, November 4 at 7:00 p.m. in the High School Auditorium with one parent or adult guardian.

Transportation/Registration

\$175 fee to Community Services covers registration and transportation for eight trips to Welch, plus two make-up days if needed. Buses will depart as soon as possible after school from the Northfield Middle School and Northfield High School. Students will ski and board until 8:15 p.m. and be returned by 9:15 p.m. Schools will not be accessible upon returning to Northfield. Buses will have a driver present or will be locked when at Welch.

Passes/Lift Tickets

All Ski & Snowboard Club members must have a Welch Village pass (purchased from Community Services directly) <u>or</u> will need to purchase a lift ticket through Community Services by noon on the Friday prior to the desired Monday trip. *Lift tickets for ski/snowboard club are not sold at Welch*.

- Night Club Pass \$165 (after 3 pm any day)

- Lift Ticket \$29

Waivers

<u>All season pass holders, lift ticket users, and renters,</u> must complete Welch's waiver/liability forms prior to participation. A link to the required form/s may be accessed via your confirmation email. The electronic waiver for pass holders will need to be submitted by December 20. Those purchasing a lift ticket will need to submit the electronic waiver by noon on the Friday prior to the first desired Monday trip. Those renting will need to submit an electronic rental waiver by the Friday prior to the first desired Monday trip.

Rental Equipment

<u>Renters must make payment through the Community Services office</u> by noon on the Friday prior to the desired Monday trip. The rental package is \$29.00/time or \$205 for eight times. Rental packages include skis, boots, poles, and helmet, OR snowboard, boots, and a helmet. *Payment for rentals will not be accepted at Welch*.

Bus buy-on

A single day bus buy-on may be purchased for \$28 by contacting Community Services. Payment is due to the Community Services office by noon, on or before the Friday prior to the desired Monday trip.

Lessons

90 minute lessons available from Welch instructors. Lessons must be purchased directly through Community Services, not Welch.

- 2 lessons: \$49 (1/6 & 1/13)
- 3 lessons: \$69 (1/6, 1/13, & 1/20) recommended by Welch

Transportation

Transportation will be arranged with Northfield Lines. We expect to accommodate all participants; however, preferences will be given to students who have signed up for the full season. In the past, we have had space for almost all part-time skiers and boarders. Students must use the transportation provided, both going to and coming from the ski area. Students will be released to their own parents and no one else for any alternative transportation. The parent must talk to the advisors directly for the student to be released, or the student will not be allowed to attend the following week.

Equipment Storage

Northfield Lines reminds parents that ski equipment cannot be carried on regular school buses. Storage is available at both the middle and high school and should be dropped off in the morning (middle school – storage room near cafeteria & high school – upper balcony across from the wrestling room). Equipment is transported to and from Welch on the bottom storage space of the Charter Bus. **PLEASE CLEARLY LABEL ALL SKI/SNOWBOARD BAGS & EQUIPMENT!**

Refunds

Available if the eight guaranteed times don't happen, injury, or an extended illness occurs. If you miss an occasional day of skiing or boarding for any reason (including disciplinary reasons), transportation money will not be refunded.

Middle School Parents Please Note

Parents dropping off students and skis before school for Ski & Snowboard Club must park in the parking lot to unload skis. PARENT PICK-UP IS AT 9:15 pm. Students not picked up by 9:30 pm will be dropped off at the Northfield Police station to wait for their parents.

Rules and Regulations

Because Ski & Snowboard Club is a school activity, all school rules relating to smoking, vaping, juuling, drugs, and alcohol, etc. are the same as being in a school building and on the school grounds. Skiers will be referred to the assistant principal if school rules are broken. While on the bus, please follow the directions of the advisors and driver. Any disrespect to advisors, bus drivers, or Welch personnel will not be tolerated and may result in suspension from Ski & Snowboard Club. Lock up your equipment at Welch. If anyone has equipment stolen at the ski area, report the theft to the ski area office and call the Goodhue County sheriff. Please let the advisors know about the theft too. Be on the bus and ready to leave at <u>8:25 pm</u>. Those who are late <u>will not</u> ski the following Monday.

Injuries

As in all sports, accidents do happen. Helmets and wrist guards are strongly recommended for all snowboarders. An injured skier or boarder is reported as quickly as possible to the ski patrol. The ski patrol assists the injured person on the hill, applies any necessary first aid and brings the person down the hill to the first aid room where an accident report is filled out. In the event that the injury is considered serious, a club advisor will attempt to contact the parents by telephone to inform them of the injury. If the ski patrol feels it would be unwise or uncomfortable for the student to ride the bus back to Northfield, parents must arrange alternative transportation for the injured person. If the parents cannot be reached or if the parents cannot arrange transportation for the injured student, a Red Wing ambulance will be called to transport the person to the Red Wing hospital. Advisers are not legally responsible for the injured student if an ambulance is called. An advisor will ride along as a comfort to the child, but it is the parents' responsibility to pick up their child at the hospital. In case the parents cannot be reached, the Northfield Police will be notified and informed of the situation. Parents are urged to check their medical and hospital coverage to be sure it covers skiing and boarding injuries. No accident insurance is provided by the school or Welch Village. We look forward to another season of safe, fun skiing and boarding!
