

- Smooth start the school yr. This is the first summer that Scott has not had to hire/add a licensed staff member and of past/current staff everyone is in same position as last year.
- Scott visited the Kindergarten classes-teaching them the "Sibley Wave" in order to make them feel welcome and create a connection.
- Rolled out the new curriculum which gives consistency throughout all the buildings, takes planning off of the teachers plate.  Local sponsors will finance and/or offset the cost for this special event!



Bond Referendum Presentation Given by Matt Hillmann and Julie Pritchard (Board Chair)

Our Vision: We will prepare **every** student for lifelong success within a world-class learning environment with a commitment to community partnership and sustainability.

Why? Strong start and secure schools 1. Focus on Early Learning 2. Security of our schools 3. Cost is less What's included:

1. New Greenvale building- plan for 600 students mostly classroom, will utilize some current storage options. Room for growth in this school.

2. Early Childhood: it would double the program...Parents will be able to utilize convenience of everything from education to childcare being in one building.

3. Sibley-7 million in construction budget. New Music along with larger cafeteria. Additional cafeteria space along with access to loading dock so there will be no interaction with students providing more school security and no interruption to students while supplies are being brought into the school. The goal is also to utilize the cafeteria throughout the day on either side of the lunch hours. Bathrooms will be in the plan for the new cafeteria. 4. Bridgewater- move main office from the center of the building to the front of the building.

Timeline: Once passed-2020 is predicted finish

- Sibley limited disruption. Renovation portion will be done over the summer of 2020 opening doors for that school year.
- Greenvale will be on the same timeline.
- Early Childhood will most like be a little bit later since they have to have the new building built first to transfer everything over and make way for Early Childhood.

Site Teams of staff and parents along with Scott Sannes will be formed at Sibley to get information out pertaining to the referendum. Each school with have their own Site Team. Asking parents to volunteer to serve on any of the site teams. Parent to parent communication is key to passing along information. Less than 60% of parents in the district voted on the last referendum.
