

#### PTO Officer Update from Pasha Quaas

- New officers are needed:
  - President & Secretary terms are up Heidi has volunteered to stay on as secretary as she has a kindergartener starting next year.
- Vice-President & Treasurer have one year left in their terms.

#### Open discussion:

- ▶ The new literacy curriculum:
  - The new literacy curriculum can still be personalized based on the classroom and the teachers needs.
  - Training began in June of 2018 and some classrooms adopted the new curriculum up to a year before the official program launch.
  - Some things needed to be "taken away"
    - A. In order to minimize variables, giving the new curriculum the time it needs.
    - B. To prevent resources from being directed beyond the new curriculum during its initial run.
  - The program was evaluated midway through the year.
  - District wide, grade level meet ups have been used to work out the bugs and to provide support to teachers as they implement the new curriculum over the course of its first year.
- MoveFive:
  - Works with teachers to work with small groups of students in third grade.
  - This program returned again this year but with fewer hours.
  - \$2,000 was spent on each building by MoveFive.
  - More volunteers are needed to work with the children that are struggling.
  - We have 1 Reading Recovery Person.
  - One on one is critical.
  - Could we reach out to our retirement community to help provide one on one with students that would benefit from one on one.
  - Sibley has a reading support person from January 1st-April 20th.
  - ▶ Proposal:

Volunteer coordinator to work with Mrs Hehr, and with teachers to help fill the gap. Fill the void to get books in the hands of kids.

There is a need to coordinating ideas and parents to give these issues a voice.

If we had targeted reading positions is this something PTO could help with?

Discussion will continue at the next PTO meeting.
