# News from the Counseling Office:

On Tuesday, February 27, all 11th grade students will take the ACT with writing (for free!) during the school day. There is nothing students and families need to do in advance in order to register for this test date. As part of the pre-registration session students will complete during their chemistry classes, they will have the opportunity to send their ACT scores to up to four colleges free of charge. Students are encouraged to take advantage of these four free score reports. Sending them after the fact will cost \$13 per college, and even if future scores end up higher than this particular score, colleges will not penalize students.

For students who wish to study and prepare for the ACT, there are many resources out there, and the following two are great places to start without investing extra money:

- 1. Naviance Test Prep is located within each student's Naviance account. This is the same online ACT test prep package that ACT offers (at a cost) through their website. If students have questions about logging in to Naviance or about Naviance Test Prep, they can contact their counselor.


