News from the Principal

Welcome to new and returning Middle School Families:

I hope everyone has been enjoying their summer and has some fun events planned for August. I took a vacation hiking in the Grand Tetons in Wyoming in June and will be spending six days fishing and canoeing in the Boundary Waters Canoe Area about the time you receive this newsletter. If students have any good summer photos they would like to share, Mr. O'Keefe will be sending out a Schoology message to post their best summer photo (*only one please*). Students should get permission to post the photo from a parent. At the end of the summer we will compile all the photos for everyone to view. Photos can be scenic, of family/friends or of wildlife. As long as they are appropriate and a parent gives permission, they can be posted. Deadline for posting will be Tuesday August 22, 2017. Grade 6 students will find information in the newsletter on how to access Schoology.

Even though August is one of my favorite months of the year, it also is a sign that school is right around the corner. I would like to personally welcome all of our 6th grade families to the Middle School and let you know that newsletters and weekly Skylert messages are the main way of getting information to families throughout the year. As we look at this coming school year, we have a few new academic pieces that everyone should know about. The first is our District priority to offer a Social Emotional Learning curriculum for all students. At the Middle School this will be incorporated in our grade 6 Science classes, grade 7 has a new required Health class and grade 8 will have the curriculum delivered in their Health class. The name of the curriculum is "Second Step" and will have lessons mixed into the current curriculum throughout the whole year. To update everyone, we will send out an information sheet several times during the year as an attachment to my weekly Skylert.

Another program that we are excited about is "Ramp Up to Readiness." This curriculum is primarily for grades 7 and 8, but we will be adapting a program for grade 6 as well. Details for grade 6 are still being worked on, but "Ramp-Up" will be delivered during grade 7 and 8 Health classes. This will also meet our district priority to get students career and college ready. Look for updates for this program as well, and we have a vision of expanding to other subjects in the years to come.

The final new academic piece I want to point out is for grade 8 students. For those of you who attended the Middle School last year you may have had a "Flex" study hall during hour 4. This year, we have a group of grade 8 teachers that will be trying to implement a similar program during hour 5. The hope is to have an hour a day when most students have access to some of their teachers for homework help, make up or finish tests, quizzes or labs. This is our first year trying this program, so please be patient as we work out any kinks.

We are all excited for the 2017-18 school year and believe that every student deserves the best education we can provide. This all starts with our **NMS PRIDE** program. Students and adults are expected to not only know what this is, but make it part of who they are. We tell students that PRIDE is not something they pick-up and leave as they go in and out of the middle school, it is something they carry with them every place they go. As one of the ways for us to partner with families, we encourage everyone to use the PRIDE language at home. It takes some time to build the habit, but the results will be amazing.

Enjoy the final weeks of summer and I will see all of you on September 5, 2017.

What is Schoology and how do students get access?

Schoology is Northfield Public Schools learning management system that connects students with adults and their classes. At the Middle School, we use Schoology to send students important information about what is coming up, get feedback on different topics. Students are able to communicate with teachers, pull up homework, take quizzes, submit assignments and much more from anyplace they have internet access. Schoology is a web based program that can be accessed from any computer, iPad or phone.

Logging in is easy. Students go to [Schoology.com](https://www.schoology.com), click "Log In" and enter their school e-mail and password. Forgot your e-mail or password? Not a problem.

All students school e-mail addresses are their **first name.last name@northfieldschools.org** and passwords are the **first 4 letters of their first name and four digit lunch code** (*does not change from year to year*).

Students will be given directions on how to access classes in September, but are able to receive school wide communications as soon as they log in.

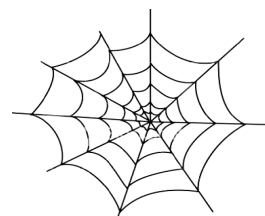

Parent Open House - Wednesday, August 30, 2017

We will have a fall Parent Open House for **parents only** on Wednesday, August 30, from 5:30 -7:30 p.m. (*before the start of school*). Parents will have the opportunity to walk through their students **maroon day (day 1)** schedule without the assistance of their son/daughter. Each class simulation will be 8 minutes in length. Maps will be available. These 8-minute mini classes will give parents a chance to hear a general description of the class and receive some information about iPad use. Gold Day teachers will be available following the 7th period session. You will have an opportunity to add funds to your child's lunch account throughout the evening.

Attendance

Please call the attendance line each day that your child is absent. You may reach the 24-hour voice mail system by dialing 663-0655.

E-mailing teachers **DOES NOT** count as official notification for state attendance records. When calling the attendance line, please leave your student's name, grade, reason for absence and your relationship to the child. If calling in an illness, please leave information regarding symptoms. Our health services staff is required to file a report with the State

Health Department if there is an unusual increase in certain illnesses. Students who are not called in will be considered unexcused until a parent/guardian notifies us. If you should forget to call in, your child may turn in a note to the attendance window outside the office when he/she returns to school. Students may not call in their own absences.

If your child is absent for **three consecutive days**, you may leave a request for homework on the attendance line when you call in your child's absence

information on the third day. Requests should be made by 9:00 a.m., so teachers can use their prep time to gather work. Homework will be requested on your behalf and any available homework can be picked up between 3:00-4:00 p.m.

Family Access

The Family Access student data system involves parents in the education process and allows the district to provide information as soon as it becomes available. Parents can view their student's attendance with a convenient calendar, access a detailed class schedule, and look at food purchases and balances online.

Parents can also view week-to-week grade book information with test, assignment, and quiz scores for their students. In addition, our Skylert message system uses the information you have in Family Access for emergency communications and meal account notices.

To apply for a Family Access login and password, go to the district's website at www.northfieldschools.org and click on Family Access. At the bottom of the screen, click on "Apply Now". Fill out the form, and login information will be e-mailed to you. Please edit/update your Skylert profile annually.

Has your family experienced a change in home or cell phone numbers, residence and mailing address changes or a change in e-mail address since last year? If so, please notify the office of

Middle School Athletics

Please pick up your football equipment from either session to help start practices on the 28th. The normal practice schedule (3:00-4:30) will resume with the start of school on September 5th.

Boys/Girls Soccer, 6th grade Football, Volleyball, and Girls' Tennis practices will begin on the first day of school, September 5th from 3:00 pm-4:30 pm. Cell Phones and Electronics

Cellular phone use is prohibited during school hours at the Middle School. All cell phones should be turned off prior to entering the academic wings. The expectation for cell phones is that they are not needed between the times of 7:45 am to 2:51 pm. If there is a need for a student to have a cell phone at school, staff should not hear it or see it. It should be put in a locker during the day.

Cell phones are not permitted in classrooms, during transition times, or in the lunchroom between 7:45 am and 2:51 pm. If any staff member sees a phone out in classrooms, during transition times, or in the lunchroom, it will be labeled and taken to the office. The phone can be picked up after 2:51 pm. Additionally, video recording students or staff without their consent is prohibited at Northfield Middle School.

Nurse Notes

Information for all NMS students:

Summer is a good time to get dental/vision exams and physicals/immunization review scheduled before the start of the next school year! Minnesota State Immunization Law states all students who attend public schools must provide the required immunizations OR a Legal Exemption. Students who are non-compliant will not be allowed to attend school according to MN law. This law pertains to all students but 7th grade is most affected.

Requirements for incoming 7th grade are: all childhood shots and an updated Tdap, Meningitis-MCV and 2 varicella or proof of Chickenpox. Rice County Public Health provides immunizations for those who qualify. See details below or visit Minnesota Department of Health website for more information on immunizations and disease.

Middle School students who will be participating in High School Sports are required to have a sport physical on file

before participating. A copy should be given to both the High School activities office and the NMS nurse office. Sport Physicals are valid for 3 years and must be on the appropriate MN High School League Sport Physical form. Please note: these are not automatically sent from the clinic, you must request a copy and provide it to the nurse office. (Sport physicals are not required for Middle School sports.)

Students with specific health needs such as Diabetes, Seizures, Asthma, Severe allergies, etc. will need to provide a care plan/med order from your physician yearly.

Students needing administration of medication at school requires a physician order form and signed by the parent/guardian yearly. Medication must be in a properly labeled container. Medication order forms may be printed off of the School District website or picked up in the nurse office during the school year.

Parent/guardians will be expected to deliver their students prescribed daily

medications such as Ritalin, Adderall, Anti-depressants, etc. Students may not carry those medications in their school bag.

Parents/guardians are responsible for providing their students necessary health supplies, health updates, emergency medication for field trips and daily needs while at school.

The School Nurse office is staffed while school is in session, and only part time the week before school starts. You may mail/FAX 507-663-0660/email or drop off health information for the school year.

Please review the emergency phone numbers/contacts you have given the school. Provide updates so that school staff can reach you when needed.

IMMUNIZATIONS REQUIRED TO ENTER 7TH GRADE:

All students entering 7th grade in the fall of 2017 must have all required childhood immunizations on file, or a legal exemption, in order to attend public school in Minnesota.

Summer is the perfect time to complete immunizations for your student. Contact your local clinic or Rice County Public Health (507-645-9576) to schedule an appointment. Parents may review their student's current health record on Family Access

Required immunizations for students entering 7th grade:

Tdap (tetanus/diphtheria/pertussis) – *if they have not had Tdap after their 7th birthday, then a new one needs to be given for entrance to 7th grade.*

Varicella vaccine - *two shots are required if student has never had chicken pox*

or chicken pox reporting: only persons who had chickenpox in 2010 or later, must have provider documentation of disease.

Parent may report the disease to the school if before that date.

Meningococcal (meningitis)

Please mail (NMS 2200 Division Street South, Northfield, MN 55057), fax (507-663-0660), or deliver immunizations to the NMS Health office **by August 25th, 2017**. Students not in compliance with state law will have their iPad disabled or withheld until proper documentation is in place at school.

Orchestra News

Welcome Back Middle School Orchestras!

All orchestra students should plan to play on their first day of orchestra in the fall. Violin and viola students should bring their instrument from home, while cello and bass students use instruments kept in the orchestra room. Please check that your child's instrument case is labeled

with their name before it is brought to school.

I would also like to let you know what materials students will be using in the fall:

6th grade orchestra students will use String Basics, Book 2; 7th and 8th grade students will use Essential Technique 2000 for Strings, Book 3. These books

are available at most music stores, or can be purchased at school.

I hope you enjoy the rest of the summer, and I am looking forward to seeing everyone again!

Students won't need their instruments for the first day of band, but should bring them to the second day. 6th Graders should also bring their red band book from last year. All students will be assigned a locker for their band instrument. 7th and 8th Graders will have the same locker as last year. Students can bring a lock to lock their band lockers if they would like to. Most students don't find it necessary to lock their band lockers.

Band lessons will not start until the third week of school. Once the lesson schedule has been completed, all band students will have access to it in schoology. 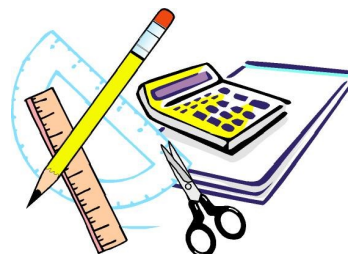

Annual Notifications from the District Office

Student Citizenship Handbook Distributed

The 2017-2018 Student Citizenship Handbook is distributed to all secondary students on their iPad and the youngest elementary school-aged child in the family.

The handbook includes information regarding expectations for student behavior. The handbook includes a comprehensive list of regulations for student behavior and consequences for misbehavior. Included in the handbook is the district's policies on Bullying, Hazing, Personal Possessions/Lockers, Technology Use, Harassment, Possession of Controlled Substances, Weapons, and Student Use and Parking of Motor Vehicles (including patrols, inspections and searches). Consequences are consistent, but vary depending on the severity of the offense, the student's grade level and previous violations. The handbook also includes a chart that outlines offenses that could possibly lead to expulsion.

The rights and responsibilities detailed in the handbook apply to students in any school, on district property, at school bus stops and at school or district events. Consequences may also apply for misbehaviors that take place at other locations, but which directly affect school programs or activities.

Parents are encouraged to read and review information in the handbook with their student(s) before finding a place to save it for the school year. Teachers will also briefly review information in the handbook with students at the start of the school year.

Northfield Public Schools in Compliance with AHERA

The Asbestos Hazard Emergency Response Act (AHERA) of 1986 requires the district to notify parents annually concerning asbestos-containing building materials in the schools, and that the management plan for each building is available for their review. Federal law requires a periodic walk-through (called "surveillance") every six months of each area containing asbestos. In addition, the law requires all buildings to be re-inspected every three years after a management plan went into effect. IEA (Institute for Environmental Assessment) completed this for the Northfield Public Schools in 2013. For the 2017-18 school year, Northfield Public Schools does not have any asbestos removal projects planned. This past summer, Northfield Public Schools continued the abatement of mercury/asbestos containing flooring at Sibley Elementary School. Any questions concerning this notice or an explanation of our Asbestos Management Plan can be directed to the Director of Buildings and Grounds at 507.663.0610.

The following notice is published pursuant to Minnesota law, "Parents Right to Know Act."

Northfield Public Schools recognizes the importance of our students' and employees' health and well-being. Therefore, we are examining and reducing our use of pesticides and utilizing Integrated Pest Management techniques in our school buildings and on school grounds to minimize the possible long-term unknown health effects of pesticides.

Northfield Public Schools will make available, in the school district office, for parents and employees, the estimated schedule of application of pesticides classified by the United States Environmental Protection Agency as designated under the Federal Insecticide, Fungicide and Rodenticide Act. Parents may also request that the school district notify him/her prior to the application of such pesticides on a day different from the days specified in the notice. If a person would like to be notified prior to application, please provide an email address or a name and telephone number to the Buildings & Grounds Department at 507.663.0610.

Indoor Air Quality

Northfield Public Schools continues to improve an indoor air quality management plan for the district. The management plan is based on the Environmental Protection Agencies (EPA) "Tools for Schools." It addresses policies and procedures that will be used in the schools to address indoor air quality issues. The plan's goal is to provide indoor air quality that contributes to a favorable learning environment for students, productivity for teachers and staff, as well as an environment that is as healthy as possible.

However, the intent of the plan is not to solve all indoor air quality concerns in a school, rather the intent is to provide a road map to assist in managing indoor air quality. The Indoor Air Quality Committee has joined the Health and Safety Committee to review and continually update the management plan. Special Education Services Available at all Schools

Federal and state laws guide the school district in identifying, evaluating and serving students with disabilities.

Northfield Public Schools serves students with disabilities from birth through age 21. A team of special educators, general educators and families work together to develop an Individualized Educational Plan (IEP) for students who meet the criteria for services. The IEP team considers the student's present level of performance, identifies educational needs and develops goals to meet those needs. The team determines the educational program that will serve the student in the least restrictive setting.

Northfield Public Schools provides a continuum of services for students with disabilities. Most students receive special education in their neighborhood school. The district also has specialized, center-based programs for students who need more support.

District in Compliance with State-Required Background Checks

Parents and community members are always encouraged to apply as an employee or volunteer at their student's school and/or with Northfield Public Schools. Volunteers provide a valuable service to students and staff. Minnesota Statute requires a school hiring authority to request a criminal history background check on all individuals who are offered employment in a school and on all individuals, except enrolled student volunteers, who are offered the opportunity to provide athletic coaching services or other extracurricular services to a school, regardless of whether any compensation is paid. Parents and community members who volunteer on a regular basis must complete a background check before serving students affiliated with Northfield Public Schools.

Data Privacy Practices

Pursuant to the requirements of state and federal law, the following constitutes Northfield Public Schools Annual Notification to parents and students regarding data privacy practices.

Northfield schools maintain educational records on all students to help plan the student's educational program, communicate with parents/guardians, and comply with state regulations. Student records include information such as standardized achievement and ability test data, grades, attendance records, health/medical records and evaluation by professional staff.

Except in limited circumstances authorized by law, most information from student records will not be released to members of the public without the written permission of the student's parent or guardian, or of the student, if he or she is 18 or older.

District policy guarantees parents/guardians (and students 18 and older) the right to examine the contents of their own student's records except those items that are, by state or federal law, made confidential.

Parents/guardians (and students 18 and older) have the right to challenge the accuracy of these records and also the right to authorize or deny release of records requested by a third party.

The district forwards educational records of students to other schools and school districts in which the student seeks or intends to enroll upon request of that school or school district. Parents are not notified prior to this transfer.

This review of the data privacy rights of students in the educational records maintained by Northfield Public Schools is intended only to be a summary of the district policy and applicable state and federal law. Notice of Designation of Directory Information

School districts are required by state and federal law to notify parents and students that certain information contained in a student's education record may be made public without prior written consent. The Northfield Public Schools designates the following as "directory information" and may, in accordance with the Minnesota Data Practices Act, release the following directory information without permission unless the district has been notified that it should not be released.

- Student's name, address, telephone number
- Parent's name, address, telephone number
- Student's date of birth
- Student's major field of study
- Student's dates of school attendance, grade level completed, enrollment status
- Student's participation in officially recognized activities/sports
- Student's height and weight, if a member of an athletic team
- Middle and High School Student Athletic Physical Examination Expiration Date
- Student's degrees, honors and awards received
- Student's most recent educational agency or institution attended
- Student's photograph(s), videotapes and other visual representations for school-approved publications, yearbooks, newspapers, public presentations and web pages.

A parent/guardian of a student or an eligible student (18 years of age or older) may object to the listed directory information being disclosed without the parent/guardian or eligible student's prior written consent except to school officials as provided under federal law. In order to make all directory information private, the parent/guardian or eligible student must submit a completed Denial of Release of Directory Information (Appendix C to Policy 515-Protection and Privacy of Pupil Records) to your student's building principal or the Superintendent of Schools. This designation will remain in effect for the current school year only.

Federal and state laws require all school districts to provide military recruiters, upon request, with the name, address and telephone number of all 11th and 12th grade students within 60 days after the date of the request unless the parent or eligible student (students over 18 years old and not a dependent) requests that the information not be provided without written permission. If you do not want Northfield Public Schools to release your student's name, address and telephone number to a military recruiter, you must complete Appendix D (Denial of Release of Information to Military Recruiters) to Policy 515-Protection and Privacy of Pupil Records. Please note that if you previously submitted a Denial of Release of Directory Information (Appendix C), it alone will not be sufficient. The law requires that a specific denial of access to military recruiters be made. **In order to make all directory information about a student private to the public in general, including military recruiting officers, the parent/guardian or eligible student must complete Appendix C and Appendix D.**
