News from the Principal

Middle School Families:

I am in total amazement at how fast each year goes by. It seems like just yesterday that our grade 6 families were anxious about starting and high school seemed like forever away for grade 8. Reality is that not only have we passed the mid-year point but registration for next year is right around the corner. Make sure to look carefully for registration information in the newsletter and don't be afraid to ask current teachers or someone in our student support office any questions you may have.

Other important events coming up this quarter are Conferences on March 1 and March 6 from 3:30-7:30 PM. Also just around the corner is MCA Testing in April. Middle School students made big gains last year and we are looking for that trend to continue. Testing will happen in students' Math, English or Reading and grade 8 Science for their specific assessments. We had students test only one hour a day last year and students overwhelmingly told us it was a much better atmosphere and they were less anxious. One way our families can help our students perform to their best is to make sure they are getting proper sleep and eating a good breakfast.

This past week students took a survey about breakfast - I have to admit I was a little surprised by what we found out. Of the 750 students who responded to the survey, 74% said they eat breakfast at home. My surprise came when I did the math and figured out that this means more than 10% of all middle school students do not eat breakfast. That is nearly 100 students a day. Please help get our students off to a good start. Insist on some type of breakfast and if it cannot be at home, the middle school has a great variety of food choices for students to choose from.

My final note is one of encouragement. Our students continue to shine in showing PRIDE both academically and in continuing a culture of respect. We have had many new students join the middle school from other communities in Minnesota and from other states. A common conversation I have with these new parents is how easy of a transition their students had, and the students themselves tell us this is a safe and welcoming place. We should all be proud of our students and the incredible individuals they are becoming. Let's keep working together to support our students. We are making a difference both in school and out in the community.

Please look through the newsletter carefully for many important pieces of information. Know our doors are always open to support you and your students.

Nurse Notes

ATTENTION 6th Grade students:

Minnesota State Immunization Law requires the following immunizations before entering 7th grade in the fall of 2018.

Please provide a copy for the Health office when shots are given so your health records can be updated at school.

- Tdap, a new one needs to be given unless they had one after their 7th birthday.
- 2 Varicella vaccines OR proof of Chickenpox
- Meningitis (meningococcal) MCV
- All childhood vaccines must be on file
- OR, provide a notarized Legal Exemption, or medical exemption signed by your physician

You may schedule your immunization appointment now with your clinic. Get them done early since supplies become limited in August.

Strep

Signs and symptoms you may have:
Sudden onset of sore throat
Fever/nausea/vomiting/stomachache
Bad headache
Inflammation of throat, tonsils, enlarged

cervical lymph nodes

May have skin rash

Throat culture is necessary for diagnosis; antibiotics are prescribed for treatment.

May return to school after 24 hours of antibiotics and fever free.

Medication

For prescription medication to be given at school a completed School Medication Administration Form must be on file. The name of the medication, dose, time of day, parent & physician signature is required. School staff are not allowed to administer any prescription medication without this on file. You may FAX to 507-663-0660

Influenza

The flu is a respiratory disease caused by a virus that attacks the nose, throat, and lungs. It can be mild, but is sometimes severe and at times can lead to death. It is not the same as the "stomach flu". Symptoms include: fever, dry cough, sore throat, headache, extreme tiredness and body aches. These symptoms come on quickly and can be severe.

Screening tool for parents:

- Fever of 100 or higher?
- Sore throat?
- Cough?

If yes, for fever and one other symptom, keep your student at home and fever free for 24 hours before returning to school, this may be 5-7 days.

****Prevention includes:** Use good hand washing, cover your cough and get a flu vaccine.

Concussions

A concussion is a type of brain injury that changes the way the brain normally works and is caused by a bump, blow, or jolt to the head. It can also occur from a blow to the body that causes the head and brain to move rapidly back and forth. Concussions can have a more serious effect on a young, developing brain and need to be addressed correctly. Go to the CDC website for more information.

In the event that we are not able to practice outside, Track/Field will practice in the gym on **maroon** days and Boys Tennis will practice in the gym on **gold** days.

Attendance

Please call the attendance line each day that your child is absent. You may reach the 24-hour voice mail system by dialing 663-0655.

E-mailing teachers DOES NOT count as official notification for state attendance records. When calling the attendance line, please leave your student's name, grade, reason for absence and your relationship to the child. If calling in an illness, please leave information regarding symptoms. Our health services staff is required to file a report

with the State Health Department if there is an unusual increase in certain illnesses. Students who are not called in will be considered unexcused until a parent/guardian notifies us. If you should forget to call in, your child may turn in a note to the attendance window outside the office when he/she returns to school. Students may not call in their own absences.

If your child is absent for **three consecutive days**, you may leave a request for homework on the attendance

line when you call in your child's absence information on the third day. Requests should be made by 9:00 a.m., so teachers can use their prep time to gather work. Homework will be requested on your behalf and any available homework can be picked up between 3:00-4:00 p.m.
