# NORTHFIELD PUBLIC SCHOOLS School Board Minutes

School Board Meeting November 23, 2009 Northfield High School Media Center

## I. Call to Order.

Chairperson Kari Nelson called the regular meeting of the Board of Education of Independent School District 659 to order at 7:45 pm. No one was absent. The School Board meeting was preceded by a reception for National Merit Scholars and their families.

#### III. Public Comment

There was none.

## IV. Approval of Minutes

On a motion by Stratmoen, seconded by Quinnell, the minutes of the Regular School Board meeting held on November 9, 2009, were unanimously approved.

## V. Announcements and Recognitions

- On November 14, three Sibley students participated in the South Central Service Cooperative's Fall Chess Tournament. Jackson Hillmann, a fifth grader, placed 3<sup>rd</sup> in the 5<sup>th</sup> and 6<sup>th</sup> grade division. Grace Hillmann, a 3<sup>rd</sup> grader, and Peter Hillmann, a kindergartner, participated in the tournament.
- Bridgewater students raised \$1,221.73 for UNICEF! And Greenvale Park students collected 320 pounds of food for the food shelf.
- The Tattered Pages Bookstore is expecting to "sell" and gift-wrap hundreds of books during its Third Annual Holiday Shopping Extravaganza. Any donations of gently used books or holiday wrapping would be greatly appreciated. To better accommodate our non-English reading families, Mayor Rossing has offered to donate many items from Present Perfect, that would fit in with a bookstore theme (stationary, pens, bookmarks, calendars, etc). The sale will be held during the school day from December 10-18.
- The H1N1 vaccination clinic on November 20 went very well. 355 people were vaccinated.
- Pritchard noted that the Northfield Area Foundation celebrated its 15<sup>th</sup> anniversary. The School District has been touched by NAF's generosity.
- Stratmoen reported that the High School production of "Fiddler on the Roof" was excellent.

- 1. School Improvement Plan Reports Northfield Middle School and the Area Learning Center. Two more school improvement plans were presented. Middle School Principal Jeff Pesta, along with staff members Ruben Alvarez and Suzie Mwarabu, and parent and community members Jill Ponder and Patty Gallivan presented the Middle School's Annual Progress Report and School Improvement Plan. Pat Parlin, Director of the Northfield Area Learning Center, presented the ALC's report and plan.
- 2. Greenvale Park Elementary School's Professional Learning Communities (PLC) Report. This presentation was the third in a series of monthly informational reports on the implementation of Professional Learning Communities (PLCs) in the Northfield Public Schools. The Board viewed a video presentation that highlighted the work being done in one of the PLCs and how those efforts directly impacted the instruction of students in their classrooms. Greenvale Park Staff Diane Torbenson, Leslee Swenson, Tony Seidl, and Anne Morrissey were featured in the video and answered questions from the Board about the work of their PLC. They shared information about identifying essential learnings for their grade level

# 5. Financial Reports –July, August and September 2009.

### VIII. Items for Information

## 1. Enrollment Options Report.

The 2009-2010 Enrollment Options Report was presented. The Northfield Public Schools has 276 students attending our schools from other school districts this school year compared to 294 last year. 772 Northfield students are attending school elsewhere, including other public schools (157), charter schools (256), home schools (128) and non-public schools (231). This compares to 705 students last year. Superintendent Richardson provided a document that provided a historical perspective on our school district's enrollment options. Berthelsen encouraged administration to "pay attention" because these statistics translate into 18% of Northfield students going elsewhere.
